##### UGLEY FAIR.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act,  
I, the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one  
of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State,  
hereby notify as follows:

1. By Memorial, dated the 2nd day of February,  
1873, a representation has been duly made to me  
by the Justices sitting in Petty Sessions for the  
Walden Division of the county of Essex, that a  
Fair has been annually held on or about the 1st  
and 2nd days of July, in the parish of Ugley, in  
the said division of the said county, and that it  
would be for the convenience and advantage of  
the public that such Fair should be abolished.

2. On the 25th day of March, 1873, I shall  
take the aforesaid representation into considera-  
tion, and all persons are to intimate, before that  
day, any objection they may desire to offer to  
the abolition of the said Fair.
