PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented to The Queen, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

ADDRESSES.

THE Board of Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Notice, of which the following is a translation, issued by the French Minister of Agriculture and Commerce, and published in the "Journal Officiel" of the 3rd instant, relative to the execution of the Franco-Belgian Treaty of Commerce of the 5th February, 1873:—

All persons who have entered into contracts for the importation into France or Algeria of Belgian products or manufactures, to be delivered in whole or in part before the 28th March, 1873, should give notice, in writing, of the said contracts to the Ministry of Agriculture and Commerce, during the fourteen days which follow the date of the present Notice, in order that they may be submitted to the Commission of which mention is made in the 1st Article of the Protocol to the Franco-Belgian Treaty of the 5th February, 1873, and which is charged with the examination of the validity, the date, and the good faith of the said contracts.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 26.)—SWEDEN.—GULF OF BOTHNIA.

(1.) *Light-vessel in Oregrund Bay.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 31, dated 26th March, 1872, on the proposed establishment of a light-vessel in the northern part of Oregrund Bay:—

The Swedish Government has given further notice, that the light vessel is now in position, and exhibits a *fixed* white light, elevated 22 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 8 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.

The vessel is moored about half a mile from the Länsmän Shoal, and is painted red, with *Grepen*, in white letters, on her sides. Position, lat. 60° 27' 30" N., long. 18° 17' E.

The light-vessel is removed when endangered by ice.

In thick or foggy weather a gong will be sounded.

(2.) *Alteration in Djursten Light.*

The Swedish Government has also given notice, that the following alteration has been made in the Djursten Light, Gräsö, viz.:—

The light shows *red* between the bearings South and S.E.

NOTE.—The upper portion of the tower will be rebuilt during the present year, and whilst building, a temporary light of less power will be exhibited.

(3.) *Alteration in position of Finngrund Light-vessel.*

Also, with reference to the notice mentioned in (1), on the intended alteration in position of the Finngrund Light-vessel:—Further notice has been given, that the vessel has been moved, and now lies two miles N.E. of the northernmost of the East Finngrund Shoals, in lat. 61° 1' 30" N., long. 18° 31' E.

(4.) *Revolving Light on Rödskallen Rock.*

Also, with reference to the same notice, on the intended exhibition of a light on Rödskallen Rock:—Further notice has been given that the light is now exhibited, and is a *revolving* light, showing a *flash* of about *fifteen seconds* duration *every minute*, elevated 84 feet above the level of the sea.

The tower, 72 feet high, is an open iron structure, painted red.

BALTIC—GOTTLAND.

(5.) *Flashing Light at Närsholmen.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 9, dated 23rd January, 1873, on the exhibition of a light at Närsholmen, south-east coast of Gottland, the following additional particulars have been received:—

The flashing light shows *six flashes* of *three to four seconds* duration *every minute*; it is elevated 70 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 12 miles.

The tower is 55 feet high, and, with the keeper's dwelling, forms a good landmark.

(6.) *Fog Signals.*

On hearing a fog signal from a vessel, it will be answered by the number of guns at the lighthouse. An immediate answer to a repeated signal cannot be depended on. Single guns from the light stations are intended to warn vessels.

Fog bells are established at Svartklubben, and on board all the light ships, excepting Carlskrona. Gongs have been established at Bjurö-klubb, Eggergrund, Ago Island, Simpnäs-klubb, Landsort, Femörehufud, Faro, Faludden, Grimskar,

and Waderöbod Lighthouses, and in Carlskrona light-vessel.
