REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

It is not expected that Gentleman will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force, for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

FRENCH COMMERCIAL TREATY.

THE following Law, continuing the existing Treaty Tariff, was passed on the 14th instant by the French National Assembly, and has been promulgated by the French Government :--

"Les Tarifs conventionnels resteront en vigueur jusqu'à l'application des Tarifs nouveaux votés ou à voter par l'Assemblée Nationale."

(Translation.)

"The Conventional Tariffs will remain in force until the application of the new Tariffs passed or to be passed by the National Assembly."

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations of 8th April, 1872), respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Supplementary Clerk (to act when required as Shorthand Writer) in the Board of Trade.

N.B.— These Regulations are liable to alteration

1. The limits of age for these situations are 16 and 20, and candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the competitive examination

2. At the competitive examinations exercises will be set in the following subjects only; the maximum of marks for each subject being fixed as follows; viz.:---

Candidates will be at liberty to offer themselves for examination in any or all of these subjects.

No subjects are obligatory, except shorthand-writing.

3. No candidate can be admitted to the competition who has not previously satisfied the Civil Service Commissioners that he possesses the requisite amount of proficiency in the following subjects :--

- 1. Handwriting.
- 2. Orthography.
- 3. Arithmetic (to Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
- 4. Shorthand-Writing.

With this view preliminary examinations in these subjects will be held at such times and places as the Commissioners may appoint.

Application for permission to attend one of these preliminary examinations must be made in the writing of the candidate, at such times as may be fixed by the Commissioners.

4. A fee of 10s. will be required from every Candidate attending a preliminary examination, and a further fee of $\pounds 1$ from every Candidate who may be admitted to the competition.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice, that an Open Competition for two situations of Supplementary Clerk (to act as Shorthand-Writer) in the Board of Trade, will be held in London, under the above Regulations, forthwith; the Preliminary Examination on Thursday, the 10th April, and the Competitive Examination on Tuesday, the 22nd April, 1873, and following days. METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

T a Meeting of the Board, at their Office, Spring-gardens, this fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventythree, amongst the Orders is as follows :-

Whereas, by the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, it is enacted that when at any time, upon any account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament, any of the parishes within the metropolis not then divided into wards, for the purpose of electing vestrymen, should be found to contain more than two thousand rated householders, it should be lawful for the Metropolitan Board of Works, upon the application, in writing, of the Vestry, or of not less than five hundred rated householders of the parish, to divide such parish into wards, and to determine and set out the number, extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards, but so, nevertheless, that no ward shall contain less than five hundred rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight: and the Metropolitan Board shall apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and should, in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward, have regard, as far as in their judgment was practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward, as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward should be a number divisible by three : And whereas the parish of Hammersmith, is comprised within the limits of the Metropolis Local Management Act, and is one of the parishes in Part I of Schedule B of that Act, and at the passing of the same Act the parish did not contain two thousand rated householders and consequently was not divided into wards, and the Vestry of the parish of Hammersmith having now applied to us, the Metro-

politan Board of Works, to divide the parish of Hammersmith into wards, according to the provisions of the 41st section of the Metropolis Local Management Amendment Act, 1862: And whereas it appears from the census of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, made by authority of Parliament, that the number of inhabited houses in the parish was returned at six thousand seven hundred and nineteen, the number of rated householders at five thousand three hundred and seventy-three, and the rateable annual value of property at one hundred and eighty-one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine pounds : Now, the Metropolitan Board of Works, having ascertained, by the account of the population taken by authority of Parliament, as contained in the Census Return for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, that the number of rated householders for the parish of Hammersmith is five thousand three hundred and seventy-three, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in the same parish. and the aggregate amount of the rating, and all the circumstances connected with such applica-tions, doth hereby order that the said parish of Hammersmith, be divided into three wards, to be distinguished by the numbers mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto. And we do hereby set out the extent, limits, and boundary lines of the said wards, as the same are described in the second column of the Schedule hereto, in conjunction with the numbers distinguishing such wards respectively, and having regard as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, do hereby apportion the number of vestrymen to be elected for the said parish among the said wards, according to the respective numbers mentioned in the third column of the Schedule hereto, in conjunction with such wards respectively.
