REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to 'The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

It is not expected that Gentleman will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will

observe the same regulations as are in force, for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

ER Majesty in Council was this day pleased, on a representation of the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Council on Education to appoint John Armine Willis, Esquire, M.A., Fellow of King's College, Cambridge, to be one of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools.

WHEREAS by the four hundred and tenth section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted, that upon the completion of any new lighthouse, buoy, or beacon, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such dues in respect thereof, to be paid by the master or owner of every ship which passes the same or derives benefit therefrom, as Her Majesty may deem reasonable, and may from time to time alter the amount

thereof, and that such dues shall be paid and collected in the same manner, by the same means, and subject to the same conditions in, by, and subject to which the light dues authorized to be levied by the said Act are paid and collected.

And whereas the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses are erecting, and are about to light, a new lighthouse on Turnberry Head, on the coast

of Ayrshire.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct, that upon the lighting of the said light there shall be paid in respect thereof for every vessel, whether British or foreign, which may pass or derive benefit therefrom, the toll of eight-sixteenths of a penny per ton of the burthen of every such vessel, for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on an oversea voyage; and one-sixteenth of a penny per ton for each time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom if on a coasting voyage.

The said tolls shall be levied by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses, subject to the regulations and exemptions contained in the New Consolidated Tables of Light Dues, sanctioned by Orders in Council, dated respectively the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, and the sixteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in an Order of Council, dated the ninth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and subject also to the gross abatement or discount of fifty-five per centum mentioned in the last-named Order in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation, bearing date the thirteenth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Portfield, in the county of Sussex, and in the diocese of

Chichester.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the fourteenth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and published in the London Gazette upon the seventeenth day of the same month, the district of Portfield was constituted out of the parish of Oving, in the county and diocese aforesaid.

"And whereas the said district of Portfield has since become a new parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the said above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said new parish of Portfield should be altered by way of extension, so that they shall include an additional portion of the said parish of

Oving.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation, the boundaries of the said new parish of Portfield shall be altered by way of extension, so that they shall include all that portion of the said parish of Oving which is described in the schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended, and is thereon coloured pink, and that from and after the day of the same date, and without any other assurance in law, the said portion of the parish of Oving, so to be included as aforesaid, shall become, and be, and form part of the said new parish of Portfield.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act

of Parliament.

- "The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.
- "The territory proposed to be annexed to the new parish of Portfield, in the county of Sussex, and in the diocese of Chichester, being:
- "All that portion of the parish of Oving, in the county and diocese aforesaid, wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded on the south partly by the parish of Rumboldswhyke, in the said county and diocese, on the west by the new parish of Portfield aforesaid, on the north partly by the last-named new parish, and on all other sides, that is to say, on the remaining part of the north, on the east, and on the remaining part of the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Portfield from the parish of Oving aforesaid, at the point at Shopwick where the road leading from Westhampnett to Shopwick joins the road which leads from Chichester to Oving; and extending thence, eastward, along the middle of the last-named road, for a distance of six and a-half chains, or thereabouts, to the junction of the same road with the road which leads from Shopwick past the Drayton Station on the line of the London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway, to Merston; and extending thence, south-eastward, along the middle of the last-described road, for a distance of about half-a-mile, to a point near the eastern end of the said railway station, in the middle of the said line of railway; and extending thence, westward, along the middle of the same line of railway, for a distance of thirty chains, or thereabouts, to the boundary at Kyves Railway Crossing, which boundary divides the said parish of Oving from the parish of Rumboldswhyke aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patron

and to the incumbents of the two cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation, and such patron and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to the said scheme or representation.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council, now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chichester.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twentieth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, in the words following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nine-teenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Paul, situate within the limits of the parish of Brighton, in the county of Sussex, and in the diocese of Chichester.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Paul, situate within the limits of the parish of Brighton as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Brighton which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Paul, situate within the limits of such parish as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Brighton.'

"And, with the like consent of the said Richard, Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester (testified

as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Paul, situate within the limits of the parish of Brighton as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that so long as the Reverend John Hannah, Clerk, Doctor of Civil Law, the present vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Brighton, shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said church of Saint Paul, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said John Hannah; and provided also, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Brighton, being:

"All that part of the parish of Brighton, in the county of Sussex, and in the diocese of Chichester, which is bounded on the south by the sea, and on all other sides, that is to say, on the west, on the north, on the north-east, and on the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the southern boundary of the said parish of Brighton, on the seashore, at a point opposite to the southern end of Great Russell-street; and extending thence northward and in a direct line across the King'sroad to and along the middle of Great Russellstreet aforesaid to its junction with Cannonstreet; and extending thence first westward and then northward, along the middle of the lastnamed street to its junction with Upper Russellstreet; and extending thence, westward, along the middle of the last-named street, to its junction with Clarence-street; and extending thence, northward, along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with Western-road; and extending thence, eastward, along the middle of the lastnamed road to its junction with North-street, and continuing thence still eastward, along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with Weststreet; and extending thence, southward, along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with Duke-street; and extending thence eastward, along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with Ship-street; and extending thence, first south-eastward, and then southward, along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with Prince Albert-street; and extending thence, generally south-eastward, along the middle of the lastnamed street to its junction with Market-street; and extending thence, southward, along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with the King's-road aforesaid, and continuing thence, in the last-named direction, and in a direct line across the last-named road to the southern boundary of the said parish of Brighton upon the seashore as aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chichester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the Sub-Chanter and Vicars Choral of the cathedral church of Lichfield, and now vested in us.

"Whereas, under an Act of the twenty-seventh and twenty-eighth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy, and by virtue of an Order of your Majesty in Council, made under the provisions of the same Act, and bearing date the ninth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and duly published in the London Gazette on the thirteenth day of the same month, certain lands and other hereditaments, then belonging to the said Sub-Chanter and Vicars Choral, became absolutely vested in us, for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

"And whereas the greater part of the lands and hereditaments aforesaid are demised by beneficial leases or grants for lives or terms of years, and produce, during the subsistence of such leases or grants, only a small annual revenue, and on that account, and in some instances on account of the character or situation of the property, are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas, by an Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, power is given to lessees holding under us, in the event of our declining to enter into a treaty for the sale of our reversions or the purchase of the leasehold interests, to require us to purchase such leasehold interests at a valuation.

"And whereas, with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the said lands and hereditaments, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund, it is expedient that the said lands and hereditaments, or such part

or parts thereof as we shall at any time, and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments, in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of, and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, with the consent of the respective holders (if any), to be testified by their being made parties to such instruments, all or any of the said lands and hereditaments heretofore belonging to the said Sub-Chanter and Vicars Choral, and so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances, and all our estate right, title, and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his, her, or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise, as he, she, or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to he just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time, as occasion may arise, in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein, convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the mean time to invest the proceeds in some Government or Parliamentry stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of an Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirtyseven, sections six and eight, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property, formerly belonging to the prebend of Preston Wynne, in the Cathedral Church of Hereford, and now vested in us.

"Whereas on the vacancy of the said prebend, which occurred on or about the twenty-third day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty, by the decease of the Reverend Edward Barnard, the then Prebendary, all the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, theretofore belonging to the said prebend (except rights of patronage), became by virtue of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, absolutely vested in us for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

"And whereas, a part of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments which so became vested in us as aforesaid, are in our possession, but a considerable part thereof are held under us for estates of inheritance by copy of Court Roll, at small annual quit rents, and on that account, and in some instances on account of the character or situation of the property, the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas, with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund, it is expedient that the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments, or such parts thereof, as we shall at any time, and from time to time, think fit should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such

manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"And whereas, under and by virtue of a certain indenture, bearing date the twentieth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, and made between John Burne, of Richmond Lodge, in the city of Bath, M.D., and Anna Louisa Burne, his wife, of the one part, and us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the other part, certain lands, comprising one acre three roods and three perches or thereabouts, situate in the parish of Preston Wynne, in the county of Hereford, and delineated on the plan drawn upon the said indenture, became and are now vested in us, in fee simple in possession.

"And whereas the lands last-mentioned adjoin

a portion of the land which formerly belonged to the said prebend as aforesaid, and it is therefore advisable that we should be empowered to sell the same, when it may seem desirable so to do.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, that we may be authorized and empowered, by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of, and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty's reign, with the consent of the holder or holders thereof (if any), to be testified by his, her, or their being made parties to such instruments, all or any of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, either in right of the said prebend or by virtue of the said indenture, with their appurtenances, and all our estate, right, title, and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his, her, or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise, as he, she, or they, shall direct (or appoint, and for such consideration as shall, upon due calculation and inquiry, appear to us to be just and reasonable; it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale, from time to time, as occasion may arise, in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein, convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock, or other public securities in England.

THEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the "burial of the dead in England beyond the limits "of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concern-"ing the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time, as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:
