

NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

MEMORANDUM.—In the Notice of the Intended Distribution of Tonnage Bounty for two slave dhows captured by Her Majesty's ship "Columbine," on the 13th and 17th December, 1871, which appeared in the London Gazette of the 25th instant, the Third Class share was, by a typographical error, inserted as £40 10s. 1d., it should have been £40 10s.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the rectory of Hope, or Estyn, in the county of Flint, and in the diocese of Saint Asaph, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the twenty-second day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and to be receivable in four equal portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August, and the first day of November, in each and every year: Provided always, that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the Incumbent of the said rectory of Hope, or Estyn, shall be paid only upon the production to us, on or after each of the said lastly-mentioned days in each and every year, of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of the said diocese of Saint Asaph, that an Assistant Curate, duly licensed by such Bishop, has been employed within the parish of Hope, or Estyn aforesaid, during the quarter of the year then ended, and is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum: Provided also, that such yearly sum or stipend shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said rectory and parish of Hope, or Estyn.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of seven hundred pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the vicarage of Saint Barnabas, Oxford, in the county of Oxford, and in the diocese of Oxford, and in respect of which we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the same vicarage, and to his successors, a yearly sum of twenty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Saint Barnabas, Oxford, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one other yearly sum or stipend of twenty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to

produce the yearly sum or stipend so payable out of our common fund, as lastly herein mentioned, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Minister or Incumbent of the district of Shevington, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, and to his successors, Ministers or Incumbents of the same district, one yearly sum or stipend of three hundred pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the fourth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said district, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of one thousand pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the benefice of Saint Martin, Low Marple, in the county and diocese of Chester, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Martin, Low Marple, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same benefice, to meet such benefaction, one yearly sum or stipend of sixteen pounds thirteen shillings and four pence, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: And we do also, in further consideration of the aforesaid benefaction, hereby grant and appropriate out of our said common fund to the said benefice of Saint Martin, Low Marple, one capital sum of five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said benefice, according to plans and a specification to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our
