WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the rectory of Saint Mary, Cefn, in the county of Denbigh, and in the diocese of Saint Asaph, one capital sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said rectory, according to plans and a specification to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said rectory of Saint Mary, Cefn.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage or benefice of All Saints, Clayton-le-Moors, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage or benefice one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and thirty-six pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common
