THE following Address of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland having been transmitted by David Graham Drummond, Earl of Airlie, K.T., to the Right Honourable Henry Austin Bruce, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been by him presented to the Queen, which Address Her Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:—

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland in the General Assembly convened, beg to acknowledge with profound gratitude your Majesty's gracious letter, in which your Majesty is pleased to convey a renewed expression of your attachment to that church: We assure your Majesty that, appreciating as we do the benefits conferred on the nation by your beneficent and auspicious reign, we are animated by sentiments of devoted loyalty to your Majesty's person and government. We are greatly gratified by your Majesty's recognition of the services which the church established by law is rendering to the Scottish people, as well as by the sympathy your Majesty is pleased to express with the labours of its Ministers. We are fully persuaded that the important qualities of christian prudence and charity which your Majesty has stated as having characterised former General Assemblies will be manifested in the present, and we trust that in all our deliberations about the interests of a church which has been so signally owned and blessed by its Divine Head as an interest of good to this land, we may be guided by that wisdom which cometh down from above, the wisdom that is first pure, then peaceable, and profitable to direct.

It affords us sincere gratification to welcome as your Majesty's Commissioner and representative in this Assembly, David Graham Drummond, Earl of Airlie, whose courtesy and kindness, as your Majesty's representative on a former occasion, so eminently entitle him to our cordial support.

We renew the expression our thankfulness for your Majesty's annual grant of £2,000 to be applied to the reformation of the Highlands and Islands, and we trust that it may be so dispensed as to promote not only the temporal, but the eternal welfare of an interesting race, who in their remote solitudes are thus reminded that they have a large share in the consideration of love which your Majesty entertains for all your people.

That your Majesty may long be preserved to reign over a free, a loyal, and a happy because a moral and religious people, is the earnest prayer of Your Majesty's faithful and devoted subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland met in this General Assembly,

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies a copy of a Proclamation which has been issued by the Administrator of the West Africa Settlements, and is as follows:—

"Whereas an Ashanti Force has crossed the Prah and entered the protected territories on the Gold Coast in a hostile manner.

"And whereas it is necessary that the supply of arms and munitions of war to the enemies of the protected tribes should be forthwith discontinued.

"Now, therefore, be it known to all whom it may concern, that we have thought fit to prohibit, and do hereby prohibit, all persons within the Settlements and protected territories on the Gold Coast and on the waters, rivers, and estuaries thereof, from selling, bartering, giving, or transferring in any manner of way, and either directly or indirectly any arms, ammunition, or warlike stores of every and whatsoever description to the Ashantis or their allies, or to other enemies of the protected tribes.

"Moreover, we have prohibited and do hereby prohibit the importation into the said Settlements and protected territories of all such arms, ammunition, and warlike stores, excepting at the ports of Cape Coast, Elmina, and Accra, or at such other port or ports at which the importer may be specially authorized to land the same by licence first obtained from the Collector of Customs.

"And all officers of Customs and other officers of the Colonial Government of the Gold Coast are to observe and enforce this Proclamation."

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

The Van Railway.

Certificate of the Board of Trade for the Construction of the Railway.

Preamble.

WHEREAS the Van Railway Company Limited have contracted for the purchase of the lands and hereditaments required for the railway and the works connected therewith, and have complied with the requirements of the Railways Construction Facilities Act, 1864, and of the Railways (Powers and Construction) Acts, 1864, Amendment Act, 1870, and have in great part constructed the railway, have entered into an agreement with the Van Mining Company Limited, dated the 19th day of December, 1870, embodying mutual stipulations between the two Companies, and are desirous that this Certificate should be issued.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do, by this Certificate, in pursuance of the Railways Construction Facilities Act, 1864, and of the Railways (Powers and Construction) Acts, 1864, Amendment Act, 1870, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers thereby in them vested, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, certify as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Certificate may be cited as The Van Railway Certificate, 1873.

Interpretation.

2. In this Certificate "The Railway" shall mean the railway by this Certificate authorised, or any part thereof, and "The Company" shall mean the Company incorporated by this Certificate.

Incorporation of Railways Act, 1867.

3. Section 21 of the Companies Clauses Act, 1863, shall, for the purposes of this Certificate, be read and have effect as provided with respect to a special Act by section 27 of the Railway Companies Act, 1867, and sections 23 to 26 inclusive of the last-mentioned Act, shall be incorporated in this Certificate, and shall apply to Loan Capital in like manner as if this Certificate were a Special Act.

Incorporation of the Company.

4. The persons in this Certificate named as the first Directors of the Company, and all other persons who shall hereafter subscribe to the Company, and their respective executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, are hereby united into a Company for the purpose of making and maintaining the railway and works by this Certificate authorised, and for the other purposes of this Certificate, and for those purposes are hereby incorporated under the name of "The Van Railway Company," and by that name shall be a body corporate, with perpetual succession and a common seal, and shall have power to take, hold, and dispose of lands and other property for the purposes and subject to the restrictions of this Certificate.

Power to purchase Railway from Existing Company.

5. The Company may, by agreement with the Van Railway Company Limited, purchase and take over and procure a conveyance and assignment of the railway and undertaking of the Van Railway Company Limited, and the benefit of the agreement with the Van Mining Company Limited, dated the 19th day of December, 1870, together with all or any of the lands, tenements, and hereditaments, plant, works, rolling and other stock, and other property and things in action whatsoever of the Van Railway Company Limited.

Power to undertake Liabilities of Existing Company.

6. The Company may also, by agreement, take upon themselves all or any of the debts and liabilities of the Van Railway Company Limited, and may indemnify the last-mentioned Company against all or any of such debts and liabilities, and may execute any agreement, covenant, or other instrument requisite for that purpose.

Capital of the Company.

7. The capital of the Company shall be £20,000, in 16,000 shares of £1 5s. each.

Power to Borrow on Mortgage.

8. The Company may from time to time borrow on mortgage, for the purposes of this Certificate, any sum not exceeding in the whole £6,666.

Appointment of Receiver.

9.
