THE Queen, taking into Her Royal consideration that upon the decease of Thomas, Earl of Zetland, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, without issue, on the 6th day of May last, the title and dignity of Earl of Zetland devolved upon his nephew and heir, Lawrence, now Earl of Zetland, as the eldest son and heir of John Charles Dundas, Esquire (commonly called the Honourable John Charles Dundas), who was the fourth, but at the time of his death second, surviving son of Lawrence, first Earl of Zetland, and next brother of the said Thomas, second Earl of Zetland, and that according to the ordinary rules of honour the brothers and sisters of the said Lawrence, now Earl of Zetland, cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them in case their said father had survived his brother, the said Thomas, second Earl of Zetland, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Zetland, Her Majesty has been pleased to ordain and declare that John Charles Dundas, Esquire, representative in Parliament for the borough of Richmond, and Her Majesty's Lieutenant of the Shires of Orkney and Zetland, William Fitzwilliam James Dundas, Esquire, Cospatrick Thomas Dundas, Esquire, Harriot Emily Dundas, Mary Dundas, Margaret Matilda Dundas, Charlotte Jane Dundas, Laura Octavia Dundas, and Alice Dundas, Spinsters, the brothers and sisters of the said Lawrence, now Earl of Zetland, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy, the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their late father, the said John Charles Dundas, has survived his elder brother, the said Thomas, second Earl of Zetland, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Zetland:

And Her Majesty has been further pleased to command that the said Royal order and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
