THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Telegram from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, stating that in consequence of some cases of cholera at Rustchuk and Shoumala passengers from those places will be subjected to ten days' quarantine at Varna; passengers by vessels from the Upper Danube with a medical officer on board may avoid quarantine by going round by Soulina or taking the Tzhernawoda Kustendje route.
