Plymouth, Feb. 28.

N Wednefday laft arrived here an Hamburger of **a**50 Tuns with Ballaft, bound for *Nanies*, which on the Munday before was met and boarded by a floop of 10 Tuns, 8 Oars, 30 men, and one Gun mounted ; the men affirming that they

belonged to Nieuport and Oftend, who plander'd her of her Cables, Sails, and Rigging, with all her Provifions, Books and Money, which they carried away with them, fleering tow-rds the Island of Guernfey. Yetterday put into this Harbor a ship from Barbados bound for London, having left the Lord Willoughby with a Fleet under his command, failing for the Leeward Islands, for the fettlement and encouragement of those Plantations,

Nemca/ile, Feb. 28. On Wednelday haft failed out from hence a Fleet of 80 fail of laden Colliers, which were Yefterday morning fallowed by 20 more, but the wind comming Southerly, we suppose may have put some stop to their Voyage.

Rye, Feb. 29. This day put in here a Privateer of Oftend where he is by Order flopped for fome time. A French Fifherman coming in this Tide, informs us that a Merchant fhip which he affirms to be French, was lately in his view caft away off *Winchelfea* Caftle, but to what place the was bound, or from whence he knows not.

Newcassle, Fcb. 29. Since the departure of the laden Fleet, fome of them have been feen put back to the Northwards by the violence of a Southern wind; Tweny fail of light fhips are now arrived at the Barr, and more daily expected.

Portfmouth, Mar. 1. Sir Thomas Allon with his fquadron is shill riding at Spithead, and with him Monsi-ur de la Roche, with another French man of War A great Fleet of Merchant ships are now riding at Coms, bound to the Weltwards. There is lately arrived at Spithead the Society from New England, very richly lader.

Aradrid, Feb. 8. The 27th pass, His Majesty quitted his Chamber, having by the advice of His Phylicians kept within 40 days after his distemper of the Small Pox was over, and is now in perfect health without any marks of the disease appearing in his face.

Yesterday Don Juan being by the Council and Ministers of State fully fatisfied in all his demands, accepted of the Government of the Neth.rlands, and the next day attended her Majesty, declaring his resolution to employ all tis study and endeavours for the defence of them, and received farther assume from the Queen of a full fatisfaction, of his defires, taking his leave with full fatisfaction, and is now preparing for his departure, having given order to the Dake de Verag (as to command a part of the Fleet to at end him upon the coafts of Biscay for his transportation, together with the forces he intends to carry over with him. Care is also taken for the defence of our Frontiers, and the Forces formerly employ'd towards Portugat, ordered forthwith to march for Catalonia.

Here is now arrived at this Court an Ambassadour f om the G eat Doke of *Muscour*, w'o intends to morrow to make his publick Entry, but as yet his Negoriation kept scoret.

Legorn, F b. 13, Some few dayes fince arrived here feveral Ships belon-ing to the Holland (onvoy, in one whereof was imbarked their Refident with his Family, intended for the Ottoman Court. The 6th inftant put in here the Admiral Gal'y belonging to the Republick of Genona, in three dayes from that Ports having conducted hither Segnior Galcotti with his Family, intending for Naples.

The Abbot de tellier is here arrived on his way from Rome, intending to emback himfelf for Genoua, and from thence to continue his Journey by land to Paris.

Maples, Feb. 7. The 28th past failed from hence a large Vessel Vessel and the set of Ammunition, bound for Spain, for the S rvice of His Most Catholick Majesty whereon is also embarqued an extraordinary Rich Coach⁹ and a Sedan, being set as a Present from the Viceroy to his Ma esty.

The good news of the Kings recove y from the small Pox, has been received as it ought, with much roy and fatisfaction, which was abundently reftified by the Viceroy, who upon the news invited to his Court all the Lords and Ladies of Quality about the Town, whom he Treated with an excellent Feast, spending the Evening with the usual Divertifements upon such occasions.

A Quarrel having lately happened between the Duke di Gaetano and the Marquifs Garaffa, the Viceroy having timely notice given him thereof, was plea ed to c nfine them to their Lodgings to prevent farther inconveniencies, and is now taking care to reconcile them.

We are here much concerned at the rude belaviour ofthe Banditi in Apruq 20, who from thence frequently commit Riots in the Countreys adjacent, to their extraordinary prejudice; they are grown lately very numerous, appearing in a warlike pofture, and are well forlify'd and furnifh'd with Victuals and Ammunition, by which they hope to defend them elv. surainft what forces can be cafily fent againft them 1 The Vice-Roy has been pleafed to invite them in upon promife of ra don, and affuring them of employments in the war, but we have little hopes that this fair way will tempt them to come in, their Captain an old man of 70 years of age, end uraing them to fland flout y upon their Guard, himf If declaring his refolution to hazard hislife in the indefence, which gives us caufe to fulpect they are encouraged by fom: greater power upon fome defign of importance.

Genoua, Feb 17. Part of the Polland Convoy which lately ar iv d here from Cadiz, brought with them, befides rich Marchandifes, the fum of 8 20 thouland Crowns in monics, but the reft of them being not yet in view, nor as yet any certain news arrived of them, tis believed fome Gallies will be fent out to enquire after and conduct them in. The Abbot de Tellicr is uddenly expected here from Rome, the Couvent of St. Prancis is preparing to receive him, and a Gally difpatcht to Legorne to transport thim hither.

From Milan we are informed of the arrival of part of the Baron de Keyfersteins Regiment, commanded by his Serjeant Major the Baron Rodolph d'Edlin. The reft of the Regiment, with the other forces lately railed in Germany by the Spanijo Ambassador being suddenly expected to follow them.

The laft week arrived in Poft at Milan the Marquifs de Grana from Vienna imen ling for Madrid, and Don Louis Poderico lately Vice-Roy of Galicia on his way for Naples, Laving both of them before their departure f om thence made their Visits to t e Governour Don Lo ys Pons de Leon.
