**A**T the Court at *Osborne House, Isle of Wight*, the 17th day of *July*, 1873.

**PRESENT,**

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**H**ER Majesty in Council was this day pleased to declare Her consent to a Contract of Matrimony between His Royal Highness Alfred Ernest Albert, Duke of Edinburgh, Earl of Kent, Earl of Ulster, Duke of Saxony, Prince of Saxe Coburg and Gotha, and Her Imperial Highness the Grand Duchess Marie Alexandrovna, only daughter of His Majesty the Emperor of All the Russias; which consent Her Majesty has also caused to be signified under the Great Seal.

facilitate the Endowment of Canonries by private benefaction.
