THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following Quarantine Notices, namely:—That in consequence of the appearance of cholera at Venice all arrivals from that port will be subjected to a quarantine of five days in all Greek ports, of eleven days in the Island of Corfu, of seven days at Trieste, and if they have left Venice subsequently to the 4th July, to the quarantine prescribed by the third paragraph of the table approved by the Ministerial Decree of 29th of April, 1867, on their arrival in any port of the Kingdom of Italy; further, that all arrivals from Trieste, and other ports in the Adriatic, as far as the confines of Turkey on the one side, and Otranto on the Italian side, will be subjected to five days' quarantine on their arrival at the Island of Corfu.
