MEMORANDUM.

Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to command that the 79th Regiment of Foot (Cameron Highlanders) be in future designated "The 79th Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders."

ORDER issued by the Local Government Board under "The Public Health Act, 1872," investing Rural Sanitary Authorities with Urban Powers:—

Leighton Buzzard Union.—Parts of Leighton Buzzard and Linslade Parishes.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Leighton Buzzard Union, in the Counties of Bedford and Buckingham, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 23 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, on the application of the authority of any Rural Sanitary District, by Order, to be published in the London Gazette, or in such other manner as they may direct, invest such authority with all or any of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, and that such investment may be made subject to any conditions to be specified by the said Board as to the time at which and the portion of the District in which such powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations are to be exercised and attached;

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the Leighton Buzzard Union, in the counties of Bedford and Buckingham, as the Sanitary Authority for the Rural Sanitary District of that Union, have applied to the Local Government Board to invest them with all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority with respect to the laying-out of streets and the regulation of buildings within certain parts of their district:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, having duly considered the said application, and acting under the authority of the several

Statutes in that behalf, do hereby invest the Guardians of the Poor of the Leighton Buzzard Union, in the counties of Bedford and Buckingham, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, from and after the 1st day of August, 1873, in respect of the portion of their district described in the Schedule to this Order, with the power of making Bye-laws with regard to all the several matters provided for in the 34th Section of the Local Government Act, 1858, such Bye-laws to be made, confirmed, and enforced in the manner provided by the Public Health Act, 1848, and the Public Health Act, 1872.

And We do hereby direct the said Guardians to cause this our Order to be published in some newspaper circulated within their district before the expiration of one calendar month from the date hereof.

The SCHEDULE above referred to.

All those parts of the parish of Leighton Buzzard, in the county of Bedford, and the parish of Linslade, in the county of Bucks, which are comprised within a line commencing from the Shaft in the Linslade Tunnel on the Main Line of the London and North-Western Railway, and running southwards along the western boundary fence of the said railway, for a distance of one thousand one hundred and twenty yards or thereabouts; thence across such railway and along the southern boundary fence of the Dunstable Branch of the said railway, for the distance of two thousand seven hundred and thirty yards, or thereabouts; thence across the said Dunstable Branch, and running northwards to a point in the centre of Capshill Bridge; thence across such bridge, and running northwards to a point eight hundred and seventy-five yards or thereabouts north of the said bridge, and two thousand three hundred and fifty yards or thereabouts east of the said shaft; thence westwards in a straight line to the said shaft to the point where the said boundary line commences.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven. section five, do hereby grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Nicholas-at-Wade with Sarre, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Canterbury, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, all those annual tenths or payments amounting to one pound twelve shillings and three pence three farthings, heretofore payable in respect of the said vicarage, and formerly receivable by the Archbishop of Canterbury, and recently by us, the said Commissioners: To have and to hold the said annual tenths or payments to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever.
