**E**ARL GRANVILLE, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has been informed by Her Majesty's Minister at the Hague, that the Proclamation of Blockade of the Coast of Acheen, of which a translation is annexed, has been issued by the Governor-General of Netherland India.

## PROCLAMATION.

The Governor-General of Netherlands India, Commander-in-Chief of the Land and Naval Forces of His Majesty the King of the Netherlands east of the Cape of Good Hope, brings to the knowledge of all whom it may concern, that in consequence of the state of war in which the Government of Netherlands India is involved with the country of Acheen, the ports and landing places, coasts, rivers, bays, and creeks of the said country and its dependencies are declared to be in a state of blockade, with all the consequences which may thereon ensue; and that the Commander of the Navy stationed in the waters of Acheen is entrusted with the execution of this measure.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of Our reign, intitled "An Act to consolidate and amend the "Laws relating to the Militia in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time where, with the advice of Her Privy Council she may see fit, to order all or any part of the Militia to be

marched out of their own respective counties, ridings, or places into any part of England or Wales for the purpose of training and exercise; and also where, with such advice as aforesaid, Her Majesty may see fit so to do, to extend or reduce the period of training and exercise of all or any part of the Militia so as the whole period of training and exercise in any year shall not exceed fifty-six days nor be less than three days :

And whereas by another Act passed in the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Our reign, intitled "An Act for amending the Laws relating to the Militia and raising a Volunteer Militia Force in Scotland," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty where, with the advice of Her Privy Council, she may see fit so to do, to extend or reduce the period of training and exercise in any year, so that the whole period of training and exercise in any year shall not exceed fifty-six days nor be less than three days :

And whereas by an Order in Council made and bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, Her Majesty was pleased to order and direct that the period of training of all the Militia of England and Scotland should be extended to twenty-seven or twenty-eight days as therein mentioned :

And whereas it is expedient that certain regiments should be trained for the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three; at the places and for the extended periods named and set forth in the schedule hereunder written :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and direct that the several regiments of Militia mentioned shall be trained in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, at the places and for the periods of training and exercise mentioned and set forth in the schedule to this Order appended.

The **QUEEN'S** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by the Borough and Local Courts of Record Act, 1872, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, from time to time, by an Order in Council, to direct, among other things, that all or any part of the provisions set forth in the schedule to the said Act shall apply to all or any Local Court or Courts of Record in England or Wales, and that within one month after such Order shall have been made and published in the London Gazette, such provisions shall extend and apply in manner directed by such Order, and that any such Order may be, in like manner, from time to time, altered and annulled, and that in and by such Order Her Majesty may alter and modify such provisions as are mentioned in the schedule, so as to adapt the same to the constitution, jurisdiction, and procedure of any such Court or Courts; and may direct by whom and at what time or times any powers and duties incident to the provisions applied under the said Act shall and may be exercised; with respect to matters in such Court or Courts; and may make any orders or regulations which may be deemed

requisite for carrying into operation in such Court or Courts the provisions so applied :

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated the 26th day of June, 1873, it was ordered that, subject to the alterations and modifications thereinafter set forth, and to such orders, rules, and regulations as Her Majesty, by Order in Council, should from time to time direct, as to the appointment of a Deputy or Assistant Judge, under section seven of the said Borough and Local Courts of Record Act, 1872, all the provisions contained in the schedule to the Borough and Local Courts of Record Act, 1872, should be extended and apply to the Court of Record for the hundred of *Salford*, in the county of *Lancaster*: Provided always, and it was thereby ordered, that the powers given by the second clause of the said schedule to the said Act should in every case be exercised either by the Judge himself or by a Deputy or Assistant Judge duly appointed under section seven of the said Act, or otherwise such Deputy or Assistant Judge being a barrister of not less than seven years' standing; but that none of such powers should be capable of being exercised by any Deputy or Assistant Judge not being such barrister :

And by the said Order Her Majesty was further pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that the powers and duties incident to the above-mentioned provisions thereby

to be applied, which were exercisable by the Court or a Judge, should and might, with respect to matters in the said Court of Record for the hundred of Salford, be exercised by the Recorder of the said hundred, or, save as aforesaid, by his Deputy duly appointed, and that the powers and duties incident to the above-mentioned provisions which were exercisable by the Master or Registrar should and might, with respect to matters in the said Court of Record, be exercised by the Registrar thereof:

And whereas it has seemed fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the said Order in Council should be annulled:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order in Council of the twenty-sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, shall be, and the same is hereby, annulled.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1869, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1869,) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as The Animals (Amendment) Order of 1873.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three; and words in this Order have the same meaning as in the Act of 1869.

*Pleuro-pneumonia.*

3. Every Local Authority shall cause all cattle affected with pleuro-pneumonia within their district to be slaughtered.

The provisions numbered (1), (2), and (3) of Article 31, and Articles 32, 33, and 34, relating to compensation of The Animals Order of 1871 shall have effect in case of slaughter under this Article of this Order.

*Foot-and-Mouth Disease.*

4. Foot-and-mouth-disease shall not be deemed to be a contagious or infectious disease within either of the following Articles of The Animals Order of 1871, namely,—Articles 19 and 27.

Any regulations made by a Local Authority under the said Article 27 as far as they relate to foot-and-mouth disease are hereby revoked.

5. Where an animal becomes affected with foot-and-mouth-disease while exposed or placed or being carried, led, or driven, as in section fifty-seven of the Act of 1869 mentioned, it may, notwithstanding anything in that section, be, with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority, authorized to issue the same, but not otherwise, moved for purposes of feeding, or watering, or other ordinary purposes connected with the breeding or rearing of animals, to any land or building in the occupation of the owner of the animal, or for slaughter to the nearest slaughter-house or some other slaughter-house approved by the Local Authority.

The form given in the Second Schedule to this Order, or a form to the like effect, with such variations as circumstances require, shall be used.

*Revocation.*

6. The Orders and part of an Order of Council described in the First Schedule to this Order, and any regulations made by a Local Authority under that part of an Order, are hereby revoked: Provided that nothing in this Order shall invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Orders and part of an Order and regulations, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against or any penalty or forfeiture incurred under the same.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Spanish Quarantine Notice which states that in consequence of the appearance of cholera at Venice, vessels which sailed from that port after the 1st July last will be subjected to quarantine upon their arrival in Spain in accordance to the reformed Article 35 of the Health Law.

**NOTICE TO MARINERS.**

(No. 67.)—AFRICA; SOUTH COAST.—ALGOA-BAY.  
*Alteration in Bird Islands Light.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 40, dated 29th April, 1873, on the alteration in the light on Bird Islands, Algoa Bay,—

The Colonial Government of the Cape of Good Hope has given further notice respecting the light, which was to be exhibited on the 1st May, 1873.

The light is a *fixed red* light, elevated 80 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of about ten miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The tower is 72 feet high, and is stone coloured.

*Directions.*—Vessels passing between the islands and the main are recommended to keep nearer the main land than the group, as the land is more readily discerned, and the break of the surf more distinctly heard. The lead also should be kept going. In passing outside the group, vessels should not approach within 3 miles of the lighthouse, as the force and strength of the current are uncertain and irregular.

The old light tower will be removed.

**NOTICE TO MARINERS.**

(No. 68.)—CANADA—ST. LAWRENCE RIVER.

(1) *Fixed Light on Windmill Point.*

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that the stone tower on Windmill Point, situated 1½ miles above Fort Wellington Prescott, on the River St. Lawrence, has been converted into a lighthouse from which a light is now exhibited.

The light is a *fixed white* light, elevated 92 feet above the level of the river, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.
