From the last health reports received at this Ministry from our representatives abroad, it results that cholera has appeared at Trieste (Austria), that the said epidemic has extended itself to the Turkish ports of the Danube, and that the yellow fever has disappeared from Pernambuco (Brazil).

You will send to a foul lazaret vessels from Trieste which may have put to sea after 13th July last, and also vessels from the above-mentioned ports of the Danube which may have left the same after the 27th of the same month, and you will consider clean, dating from the 9th of the said month, vessels from Pernambuco.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch, dated 14th ultimo, from Her Majesty's Consul at Lisbon, reporting that the Home Department there had issued Notices declaring the ports of Dantzic, Elbing, Königsberg, Helsinborg, and Cronstadt to be "infected" with cholera morbus since the 28th July, and all the other ports of Prussia, in the Baltic Sea, and all those of Russia in the Gulf of Finland, likewise the port of Elsinore, to be "suspected" of the same disease since that date. And further, the ports of Hamburg and Altona to be "infected" with cholera, and the ports of the Elbe "suspected" of the same disease since the 1st August.

landing-places of the Venetian Provinces, ships might be admitted to free pratique if no case had arisen during the voyage, after going through the prescribed formalities of medical inspection, &c.

Passengers by steamers are repulsed, there being no lazarette accommodation, while crews of sailing vessels perform the above-mentioned period of quarantine on board their respective ships.

From unofficial and trustworthy information, the Government is aware that the cholera morbus

reigns in Stockholm (Sweden), therefore the following Circular has to-day been addressed to the Governors of the maritime provinces.

Your Excellency will cut off from communication vessels coming from Stockholm which may arrive at the ports of your province, and you will consult this Department as to the sanitary treatment they are to undergo, setting forth their condition, until this Ministry decides that which may be most fitting in view of information which is expected.

From the last health reports received at this Ministry from our representatives abroad, it results that at Hamburg the cholera morbus has developed itself, and at Parà (Brazil), the yellow fever.

Your Excellency will despatch to a foul lazaret vessels from the former place, which after to-day's date may arrive at the ports of your province, having put to sea after the 8th instant, and also vessels which may have sailed from Parà after 14th July last.

According to official information, the utmost carelessness reigns at the port of Cartagena as to the hygiene of the port and town; and vessels from foul ports are admitted without being subjected to the legal enactments.

Therefore, and in view of Article 36 of the Health Law, and Rule 12 of the Royal Order of 6th June, 1860, you will impose three days of observation upon vessels from said port which may arrive at the ports of your province in a good sanitary condition, with a clean bill of health, and without any suspicious accident on board.
