THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Therapia, stating that the ports of Varna, Kustendji, and Bourgas are declared free from cholera since the 8th instant.

Arrivals from those ports, whether vessels or passengers, that may have left before this decision will only be held to perform seven days' quarantine, including the voyage, while those that leave after that date will be admitted to free pratique.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Rome, reporting that an Order has been published by the Italian Ministry of the Interior, reducing the period of quarantine on vessels arriving in Italian ports with foul bills of health for cholera to ten days, including the time of their voyage, provided that no vessel shall be admitted to pratique before undergoing forty-eight hours of observation.

The quarantine at Nisida for passengers to Sicily is also reduced to ten days.
