Cadiz, Nov. 8. This day the New Spain Fleet confifting of 19 Sail, appeared in fight of this Port; feveral Perfons are already come affore from the Ships; from whom we'understand, that the Marquis de Laguna, lare Vicercy of Mexico, is come home with them; And that the Vice Admiral Papathino joyned the Fleet this Morning with 5 Men of War. Don Matheo Olaya is now with 7 Men of War at Oran. The Chevalier de Chafteau Renaud continues in this Bay with # Ships.

Manbeim, Nov. 14. Yefterday the Garifon marched out of this Cittadel, compoled of 400 Foor, and a Troop of Horie, and another of Dragoons.' And prefently after, the Dauphin entred into the Place, and vifited the Fortifications. There were found in the Cittadel 26 Pieces of Brais Cannon, and 63 other Pieces, and two Mortars. The Matelfilal Duke de Duras pasted from hence this Morning to beliege Frankendal.

be hath reftor'd, to attain to the Treaty, c neluded at Nimeguen in the year 1678, and the Care, be bas fince taken, not only for the Eftabliffoment of the Truce, but also for the changing it into a perpetual Peace, His Majesty bad reason to hope, that the States General of the United Provinces of the Low Countries, who had floewn fo much Earnestness for the Conclusion of that Truce, would have been no lefs zealous for the maintaining of it. In the mean time His Majefty bas had divers Advices for feveral Months past, that the faid States, suffering themfelves to be carry'd away by the Defires of those, who have no other Intention than to fee a War begun again in Europe, were making extraordinary Levies and Preparations and entring into Engagements with feveral Princes of the Empire, to binder by all manner of ways the Establishment of the Cardinal of Furftemberg in the Electorate of Cologne. And His Majefty, finding bimfelf oblig'd to fupport the Interests of the faid Cardinal, whole Election was positively declar'd to be oppos'd, against all manner of Forms, only becaufe he was believ d to be Engaged in His Majesties Interests, He exborted the faid States-General by His Ambaffador the Count d'Avaux, not to employ the Extraordinary Forces, they were raifing, in any thing, that might diffurb the Quier of Europe, and caus' d it to be declar'd to them in express Terms, that the should look upon what they attempted against the Cardinal of Furstemberg, as if it were against His own Dominions; His Majesty has been fince informed, that they have not forbern to begin the Execution of their Projects, and that they Bardrawn together an Army under the Command of Prince Waldeck, which is actually joind with the Forces of the Princes, that are Leagued together against the Interests of the Cardinal of Furstemberg.
