## A PROCLAMATION <br> For the fpeedy Calling of a PARLIAMENT.

JAMES R.

WE bave thought fit as the beft and moft troper Means to E/tablifb a lafting Pecace in this our K<zigdm, to Call a Parliament, and bave therefore Ordered Our Chancellor to caufe Writs to be lffued farth for fummoning a Parliament to Meet at Weftminter upon the Fifteenth day of January next enfuiing the Date of this Our Reval Prociamation. And that nothing may be Hanting on Our Part tows ards the freedonof Elections, as We bave alveady Keficred atl Cities, TomensCorporate, and Boroughs throughout Our Kinadem, to their Ancient Cbarters, Rights and Priviledges; So We Command and Require all Perfons phatfocver, that they prefume not by Menace, or any other undiue Means, to Influence Elegions, or procure the Vote of any Elecior. And We do allo ftriefly Regaire ard Command all Sberiffs, Mayers, B.vliffs and otber Officers to whonn the Executiont or Retarn of ay Writ, Sammons, Warrant or Precept for Members to the enfuing Parliament Jhall belons, that they caufe fuch Writ, Summons, Warrant and Precept to be duly Publifocd and Executed, and Retrms thereupon, to be fairly made accordings to the true Merits of fuch EleEtions.

Und for the Security of all Perfons both in their Elections and Service in Parliament, We dobereby P:ablfh and Declare, Tbat all Our Subjects faall bave free Liberty to Elect, and all Our Peers, and Juch as Joall be Elacted Members of Our Houfe of Commons, boall bave full Liberty and Freedom to Serve and Sit in Pariament, notrvitbttanding they have taken itp Arms, or committed any AEZ of Hyftility, or been any way Aiding or Affitiong tberein. And for the better Affurance bercé; We bave Gracioully Direfled a General Pardon to all Our Subjects to be fortlowith prepared to P.jfs Our Great Seal.

And for the Reconciling all Publick Breaches, and Obliterating the very Memory of all paft Mifcarriages, We do bereby Exbort, and kimdly Admonifh all Our. subjects, to difpofe tbemfelves to Elect fuch Pcrfons for their Reprefenvatives in Parliament, as may ñot be Byaped by Prejudiceor Pafion, but 2walified urith, Pares, Experzence and Prudence proper for this Conjuncture, and agreeable to the Ends and Rurpofes of this Our Gracions Proclamation.

[^0]Vimma, Nooemb. 18 The Sieir Hopp who lately arrived here in the Qality of Enyoy Ex: traordinary from the States-Generakof the lunited Provincer, has had his fiff Audience of the Entperors It's Caid, that among other Matires, Je offerd the Mediation of his Mafters for the Concluding a Peace with the Turks. The new Levies and Recruits advance with good faccels: The States of Bolbemin raife : 6000 Men at their own charge; and Auftia, Silfia, Moravia, and the other HereditaryCountreys 8 or 10000 . The Halatine of Hungary offers to make a Levy of 3000 Hungarians; and fome others of the Principal Nobility of that Kingdom will likewile raife Troops, to the number of 4000 Men , at their own Expence; Befides thefe the Emperor has given out Commiffions for feveral newheghments; and the old ories will be recrutited each to 2100 Men . The Duke of Lorraina bas been ill again; but the laft Letters from In/pricke gave an Account that his Pever had left him, though he continued till very weak. We hear from Bofnia that General piccolmini had taken upon thim the Command of the Imperial Forces, mad that he was feting the Winter Quarters and Contribntions on that fide. We told you farmerly of a defign the Rafizans bad formed to furprize Teckeley, which they carsied on fo well, that on the 28th paft they were got, being 1500 itrong, within a Mile of Widin, where be was with about the fame number, not having the least notice of their approach. But the Rafoians:mat king a halt there, with an intention to ented the Town in the dead of Night, an Hungarian went fecretly away, and informed Teckeley of their defign, who imntediately drew his Mea together, and upon the Rafcians advancing fallied out upora them, killed 2 or 300 , and put the reft to flight, however Teckeley not thinking himfelf lafe at Widin, it being an inconfiderable open Place, retired from thence, and paffed the River; and the Raforans having rallied, and being re-inforced with fome frelh Troops, went in purfoit of himb The Count de Sathiani who Commands the Blockade of Canifa, was informed the sth Inftant by a Deferter, that the Baffa had the day before received á Letter from the Turkin Ans bafladors at Pettondorf, wherein they affire hing; that a Peace will be firddenly concluded, and in. the mean time exhort him to continue conftate. in the defence of that Place. The Tartais ane now in a great Body in Moldavia, expecting try benefit of the Proft to make Incuifionsinto hins. eary, or more probably into Poland; where tha Prowincial Dyess break up in great difcontents.
