

**The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.**

In the County Court of Warwickshire, holden at Birmingham.

In the Matter of a Bankruptcy Petition against James Thomas Gray, of Monkpath Priory, Shirley, near Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, of no profession or occupation.
