REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to the Queen.

It is not expected that Gentleman will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force, for Her Majesty's Levées.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirty-first day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four; have prepared and now humbly lay before, your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Llangammarch, out of the parish or parochial chapelry of Llanlleonvel, out of the parish of Llanafan-fawr, and out of the parish of Llanvihangel Abergwessin, all in the county of Brecon, and in the diocese of Saint David's.

"Whereas, it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Llangammarch, of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llanlleonvel, of the said parish of Llanafan-fawr, and of the said parish of Llanvihangel Abergwessin, which are hereinafter mentioned and described (such portions not at present

containing within their limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship), should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas by an indenture, bearing date on or about the fifteenth day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and made or expressed to be made between John Coke Fowler, of West Knoll, in the county of Glamorgan, Esquire, and Thomas Boone Nelson, of Lawrence Pountney-lane, in the city of London, Gentleman, of the first part, Clara Thomas, of Llwyn Madoc, in the county of Brecon aforesaid, Spinster, of the second part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the third part (which indenture is intended to be enrolled in your Majesty's High Court of Chancery), the said John Coke Fowler and Thomas Boone Nelson, by the direction of and in conjunction with the said Clara Thomas, have granted and confirmed unto the incumbent of the district hereinafter proposed to be constituted, so soon as he shall have been appointed and licensed to the said intended district, and to his successors, incumbents thereof for the time being, a yearly rent-charge of one hundred pounds issuing out of certain messuages or tenements, lands, and hereditaments which are situate in the said parish of Llanvihangel Abergwessin and which are more particularly specified in the schedule which forms part of and is referred to in the said deed.

"And whereas the said yearly rent-charge has been so granted and secured as aforesaid, upon the understanding that we should make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein-named Act to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said district, when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the herein-before secondly-mentioned Act, a grant of fifty pounds per annum, and upon the further understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said district, and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas we have undertaken and agreed to make the said grant of fifty pounds per annum as aforesaid, by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Connop, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Llangammarch, of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llanlleonvel, of the said parish of Llanafan-fawr, and of the said parish of Llanvihangel Abergwessin, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Eglwys Oen Duw.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted, and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof, shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your

Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to, and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Clara Thomas, her heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference :—

"The District of Eglwys Oen Duw, being :—

"All those several contiguous portions of the parish of Llangammarch, of the parish or parochial chapelry of Llanlleonvel, of the parish of Llanafan-fawr, and of the parish of Llanvihangel Abergwessin, all in the county of Brecon, and in the diocese of Saint David's, which said portions of such parishes are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line, commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llangammarch from the parish or parochial chapelry of Llanlleonvel aforesaid, at the point a little to the west of the house called or known as Llwyn-Cys, where the River Cammarch is joined by the stream called or known as Nant-Cwm-yr-efel; and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of about half a mile along the middle of the said stream to its source on the western side of the old road leading from Garth to Beulah; and continuing thence still north-eastward and in a direct line to a point in the middle of the said road; and extending thence northward along the middle of the same road for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Cefn Cryn gwyn to Simniai llwyd, at or near to which point of junction a boundary stone, inscribed 'E.O.D.D., 1873, No. 1,' has been placed; and extending thence for a distance of fifty-six chains, or thereabouts, first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the last-described road to the boundary in the middle of the stream called or known as Llynwyn, which flows from Pen-y-rhiw Trefan into the River Dulas, which boundary divides the said parish or parochial chapelry of Llanlleonvel from the parish of Llanafan-fawr aforesaid; and extending thence for a distance of sixty-eight chains and a half, or thereabouts, first south-eastward along the last-described boundary (thereby following the course of the stream called or known as Llynwyn aforesaid), and then eastward along the same boundary (thereby leaving the stream called or known as Llynwyn aforesaid) to a point in the middle of the River Dulas aforesaid; and extending thence generally northward for a distance of nearly three and a half miles along the middle of the said river to its junction near Tyn-y-Llwyn with Bran Brook; and extending thence westward for a distance of fifty-six chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said brook, to the fence above Tyn-y-clyn, which divides the close numbered 176 upon the tithe commutation map of the said parish of Llanafan-fawr, and upon the map hereunto annexed, from the common or unenclosed lands in the same parish; and extending thence for a distance of nearly four and a half miles, first southward to and along such fence, and then generally south-westward along the line of fences dividing the closes numbered respectively 175,

133, 132, 124, 119, 118, 117, 115, 108, 107, 53, 52, 42, 41, 36, 34, 33, 30, 28, 27, 24, 17, 11, 5, 4, 2, and 1, upon the said maps, from the common or unenclosed lands in the parish of Llanafan-fawr aforesaid, to the boundary near the house called or known as Pen-y-Cae, in the middle of Cedney Brook, which boundary divides the last-named parish from the parish of Llanvihangel Aber-gwessin aforesaid; and extending thence, southward, for a distance of a quarter of a mile, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-named brook, to its junction with the River Cammarch aforesaid; and extending thence, westward, for a distance of eighty links, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said river, to the point where the same river is crossed by the road leading from Pen-y-Cae to Allt-felen; and extending thence, for a distance of eighty-nine chains, or thereabouts, first south-westward, and then westward, along the middle of the last-described road to its junction near Allt-felen aforesaid with the road leading from Beulah to Abergwessin; and extending thence, for a distance of seventy and a half chains, or thereabouts, first north-westward and then south-westward, along the middle of the last-described road, to the point where it crosses the stream called Nant-Ffos-Ddu; and extending thence, southward, for a distance of twenty-seven chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-named stream to its source, at or near to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 160 upon the tithe commutation map of the said parish of Llanvihangel Abergwessin, and upon the map hereunto annexed, from the close numbered 159 upon the same maps; and extending thence, southward, to and along the said fence for a distance of fourteen chains, or thereabouts, to the southern end of the same fence, at the brook called or known as Nant-Cwm-Morris; and extending thence, eastward, for a distance of twenty-six chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-named brook to its junction with the Brook Esgair; and extending thence, south-westward, along the middle of the last-named brook, thereby passing along the south-eastern side of the house called or known as Esgair-ber-fedd, to the source of the same brook, on or near to the north-eastern side of the old road leading from Aberannell to Abergwessin; and continuing thence, still south-westward, and in a direct line across the said old road to a boundary stone, inscribed 'E.O.D.D., 1873, No. 2,' and placed on the southern side of the same old road, at or near to its junction with the road leading to Esgair-lâs and near to the source of the Brook Cerdin; and extending thence, first south-westward, and then southward, to and along the middle of the last-named brook, for a distance of fifty chains, or thereabouts, to a point near to the junction of the same brook with the stream called or known as Nant Caer Gof, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llanvihangel Abergwessin from the parish of Llangammarch aforesaid; and continuing thence, still southward, along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby still following the course of the Brook Cerdin aforesaid) to the junction of the same boundary with the boundary which divides the last-named parish from the parish of Llanwrtyd, in the county and diocese aforesaid; and continuing thence for a distance of nearly three and a half miles, first southward, then south-eastward, and then again southward, along the last-described boundary (thereby still following the course of the last-named brook) to a point in the middle of the road leading from Pont-rhyd-y-feri past the houses called or known respectively as Castell, Bwlch-tua-thre, and Pistyll-gwyn, to the house called or known

as Bwlch Mawr; and extending thence, generally northward, for a distance of one mile and twelve chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-described road, to a point a little to the north of the house called or known as Bwlch-tua-thre as aforesaid, and opposite to a boundary stone inscribed 'E.O.D.D., 1873, No. 3,' and placed on the south-eastern side of the same road, at or near to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 38 upon the tithe commutation map of the hamlet of Treflis, in the said parish of Llangammarch, and upon the map hereunto annexed as aforesaid from the closes numbered respectively 36 and 37 upon the same maps; and extending thence, southward, to such boundary stone, and then southward and eastward along the said fence, to the boundary which divides the said parish of Llangammarch from a certain detached portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Llanlleonvel aforesaid; and extending thence, generally eastward, for a distance of two miles and a quarter, or thereabouts, along the last-mentioned boundary, to the stream called or known as Nant-Einon; and extending thence, south-eastward, for a distance of fifty-five chains, or thereabouts, along the same boundary (thereby following the course of the last-named stream), to the point where the same boundary diverges to the south from the said stream; and extending thence, eastward, for a distance of ten chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the same stream, to the point where it is crossed by the road which leads from Llangammarch to Beulah; and extending thence, northward, for a distance of one mile, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-described road to its junction with the new road leading from Beulah to Garth at or near to which said point of junction a boundary stone inscribed 'E.O.D.D., 1873, No. 4,' has been placed; and extending thence, eastward, and in a direct line to a point in the middle of the River Cammarch aforesaid, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llangammarch from the parish or parochial chapelry of Llanlleonvel aforesaid; and extending thence generally south-eastward for a distance of thirteen and a half chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said river (thereby following in part the last-described boundary) to the first-described point where the same river is joined by the brook called or known as Nant-cwm-yr-efel as aforesaid, at which point the said imaginary line commenced.'

And whereas a draft of the said scheme, has in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons, and to the incumbents of each of the four cures, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas the incumbent of one of the said cures, namely, of the said parish of Llangammarch, has made certain objections to the said scheme, and the incumbents of the other three said cures, and the patrons of all the said four cures have respectively signified their assent to the said scheme.

And whereas the said scheme notwithstanding such objections has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like

advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifteenth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty, King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four, of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church called Christ Church, situate at Saint Helen's, in the parish of Swansea, in the county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Saint David's.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church called Christ Church, situate at Saint Helen's as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Connop, Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Swansea, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed; should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church called Christ Church, situate at Saint Helen's as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Swansea.'

"And with the like consent of the said Connop, Bishop, of the said diocese of Saint David's (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church called Christ Church, situate at Saint Helen's as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that so long as the Reverend Edward Burnard Squire, the present vicar or incumbent

of the vicarage of the said parish of Swansea, shall continue to be such vicar or incumbent, all the fees which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization, or performance at the said church called Christ Church, situate at Saint Helen's as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the minister thereof to the said Edward Burnard Squire; and, provided also, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty in your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Swansea, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Swansea, in the county of Glamorgan, and in the diocese of Saint David's, wherein the present incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which comprises generally that suburb of Swansea which is called or known as Saint Helen's, all which said part of such parish is bounded on the south by Swansea Bay, and upon all other sides, that is to say, on the north-west and on the east, by an imaginary line, commencing upon the southern boundary of the said parish of Swansea, upon the shore of Swansea Bay aforesaid, at a point due south of, and opposite to the junction of Oystermouth-road with Saint Helen's-road; and extending thence, that is, from the shore of Swansea Bay aforesaid, northward, and in a direct line for a distance of three chains or thereabouts, to the said point of junction; and extending thence, north-eastward, for a distance of half a mile or thereabouts, along the middle of the said Saint Helen's-road, to its junction with Richardson-street; and extending thence, southward, along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with Little Madoc-street; and extending thence, westward, along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with Argyle-street; and extending thence, southward, along the middle of the last-named street to its junction with Oystermouth-road aforesaid, and continuing thence, still southward, and in a direct line for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts, thereby passing to the west of the building known as the Old Swansea Infirmary, to the southern boundary of the parish of Swansea aforesaid, on the shore of Swansea Bay aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council, now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's.
