CORSHAM FAIR.

By memorial, dated the 15th day of January, 1874, a representation has been duly made to me by the Justices of the Peace acting in and for the Petty Sessional Division of Chippenham, in the county of Wilts (including the town and parish of Corsham, in the same county), that a Fair has been annually held in the town of Corsham, on the 4th day of September, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished.

2. On the 24th day of March, 1874, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer, to the abolition of the said Fair.
