boundaries of the said new parish of Saint James, Devonport, should be altered by way of extension. so that they shall include a certain additional part

of the said parish of Stoke Damerel.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose that, from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council, ratifying this scheme or representation, the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint James, Devonport, shall be altered by way of extension so that they shall include all that part of the said parish of Stoke Damerel, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended, and is thereon coloured pink, and that from and after the day of the same date, and without any other assurance in the law, the said part of the parish of Stoke Damerel so to be included as aforesaid shall become and be and form part of the said new parish of Saint James, Devonport.

1 ," And we further represent, recommend, and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory proposed to be annexed to the new parish of Saint James, Devonport, in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter, being :

"All that part of the parish of Stoke Damerel, in the said county and diocese, wherein the present Incumbent of such parish now possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded on the west by the new parish of Saint James', Devonport aforesaid, on the south by the new parish of Saint Paul, Devonport, in the county and diocese aforesaid, on the east by the district chapelry of Saint Michael, Devonport, in the same county and diocese, and on the remaining side, that is to say, on the north by the inlet called or known as Keyham Lake."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patron and the incumbent of the said parish of Stoke Damerel, and to the patrons and the incumbent of the said new parish of Saint James', Devonport.

And whereas the incumbent of the said parish of Stoke Damerel has made certain objections to

the same scheme or representation.

And whereas one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said scheme or representation

were so transmitted as aforesaid.

And whereas the said scheme or representation, notwithstanding such objections as aforesaid, has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of l Her Majesty, chapter ninety-four; and Her Majesty. by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter.

THEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-two; duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of your Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five; and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of your Majesty, chapter eighty-two; have pre-pared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Andrew, situate at Minley, in the particular district of Cove, in the county of Southampton, and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas at certain extremitics of the said particular district of Cove, and of the particular district of the Holy Trinity, Hawley, in the said county of Southampton, and in the said diocese of Winchester, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such particular districts respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that such contiguous portions of the said particular district of Cove, and of the said particular district of the Holy Trinity, Hawley, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Andrew.
