THE Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice, that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury:—

SPECIAL REGULATIONS (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by Notices in the London Gazette of the 24th January, 1873, and 21st November, 1873) respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the situation of Clerk of Works in the Board of Public Works, Ireland.

N.B.—*These Regulations are liable to alteration.*

I. The limits of age for this situation are 25 and 30, and Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

II. Candidates must possess the practical experience necessary to qualify them for a situation of this nature. They must have been employed for at least five years in the superintendence of buildings, and will be required to produce satisfactory proof of their efficiency and practical knowledge.

III. The Examination will be in the following subjects; viz. :—

1. Handwriting.
2. Orthography.
3. English Composition.
4. Arithmetic (to Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
5. Algebra (to Simple Equations).
