

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of seven hundred pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the vicarage or benefice of Christ Church, Deptford, in the county of Kent, and in the diocese of Rochester, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said vicarage or benefice of Christ Church, Deptford, to meet such benefaction, one other capital sum of seven hundred pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence

for the said vicarage or benefice, according to plans and a specification to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said vicarage or benefice of Christ Church, Deptford.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our common seal, this nineteenth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant and convey to the Incumbent of the rectory of Edmondbyers, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same rectory, all those pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments, situate in the adjacent parishes of Edmondbyers aforesaid and Muggleswick, with the appurtenances thereunto belonging, which said pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us: To have and to hold the said pieces or parcels of land and hereditaments, with their appurtenances, to the use of the said Incumbent and his successors for ever.
