Board of Trade (Harbour Department), Whitehall Gardens, April 29, 1874.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Agent and Consul-General at Tunis, stating that a quarantine of observation of from five to seven days has been imposed at that port on all vessels arriving, the papers of which are irregular or which carry more passengers than are mentioned in their bills of health. In the latter case the masters will be liable to a fine of from 50 to 500 francs, and to the payment of I piastre a-day for every passenger undergoing quarantine, unless it be undergone on board.

Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens, April 30, 1874.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Portuguese Law, dated the 9th instant, enacting the following alterations in the Portuguese Customs' Tariff:—

1. The three different duties imposed upon unrefined sugar by the Law of December 27, 1870, are replaced by a single duty of 80 reis (4.26d.) per kilogramme.

2. The import duty on railway materials is fixed at 5 per cent. ad valorem, but such materials imported by private companies duly authorized to construct common railways or tramways without receiving any subvention from the Government.

are exempted from all duty for one year from the publication of the law.

3. The duty on staves and on wooden or iron hoops for casks is reduced to half per cent. ad valorem.

4. Cereals in grain or in flour imported from Spain and cleared for consumption are to pay the duties as laid down in the Decrees of 11th April, 1865, and of 28th March, 1870, upon cereals imported by the sea ports.

5. All steamers, both Portuguese and foreign, whether they receive or discharge merchandize, and whether they land or take passengers, either in any continental port, or in the Islands of the Azores and Madeira are to pay a duty of 30 reis (1.60d.) per cubic metre.
