THIS day the Lords being met a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to grant certain duties of Customs and Inland Revenue, to repeal and alter other duties, and to amend the laws relating to Customs and Inland Revenue.

An Act to make provision for the transfer of the assets and liabilities of the Bengal and Madras Civil Service Annuity Funds, and the Annuity Branch of the Bombay Civil Fund, to the Secretary of State for India in Council.

An Act to extend to the present Bishop of Calcutta the regulations made by Her Majesty as to the leave of absence of Indian Bishops.

An Act to amend the Act of sixteenth and seventeenth Victoria, chapter one hundred and nineteen, intituled "An Act for the suppression of Betting Houses."

An Act to render valid marriages heretofore solemnized in the Chapel of Ease called Saint Paul's Church at Pooley Bridge, in the parish of Barton, in the county of Westmorland.

An Act to render valid marriages heretofore solemnized in the Chapel of Ease called Saint John the Evangelist, at Bentley, in the parish of Shustock, in the county of Warwick.

An Act for enabling the Railway Clearing Committee to purchase land by compulsion and to build thereon for the purposes of the clearing system, to defray the expenses thereof as part of the expenses of the clearing system, and by borrowing money, and for other purposes.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 63.)—VANCOUVER ISLAND, WEST COAST—BARCLAY SOUND.

(1.) *Revolving Light on Cape Beale.*

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that from the 1st day of July, 1874, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Cape Beale, south-east point of the entrance to Barclay Sound.

The light will be a *revolving* white light, seen at intervals of *thirty seconds*, elevated 164 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 19 miles.

The tower is a square building, 43 feet high, painted light stone colour. Position, lat. 48° 47' 30" N., long. 125° 12' 50" W.

NOTE.—The light should not be brought to bear to the eastward of E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., as foul ground extends off the entrances to Barclay Sound, and mariners are cautioned not to attempt to enter the Sound at night without local knowledge or a pilot.

UNITED STATES—CALIFORNIA.

(2.) *Shoal Ridge in San Francisco Bay.*

The Superintendent of the United States Coast Survey in the Pacific has given notice, that a ridge having less than 7 fathoms' water on it has been found in San Francisco Bay, extending in an irregular curved line from the north-west point of Alcatraz Island to the eastern end of the Presidio Shoal. The depth of water on the ridge is not regular, and the shoalest spot found has 24 feet on it, over gravelly bottom, at low water spring tides. This patch is about 100 yards long, and lies in the regular track of vessels; from it Bird Rock bears N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., distant 790 yards, and Alcatraz Lighthouse N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 1,260 yards.

Boneta Point Lighthouse, in line with the extremity of Point Diablo, W. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., passes 2 cables south of the shoal spot.

CATTLE, SHEEP, AND PIGS IMPORTATION PROHIBITION.

By His Excellency Sir Valentine Fleming, Knight, the Acting Chief Justice for the time being of the Colony of Tasmania, Administrator of the Government thereof.

A PROCLAMATION.

I, SIR VALENTINE FLEMING, Knight, the Acting Chief Justice for the time being of the Colony of Tasmania, Administrator of the Government thereof, by virtue of Section 23 of "The Customs Act," (25 Vict., No. 3), and with the advice of the Executive Council, do, with a view to prevent infectious and contagious distempers and diseases among cattle, sheep, and pigs, hereby prohibit the importation into Tasmania of cattle, sheep, and pigs from every port and place save and except such as appertain and belong to the respective Colonies of Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, South Australia, and Western Australia.

Given under my hand at Hobart Town, in Tasmania, this tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Sevenoaks, in the county of Kent;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Sevenoaks Union, in the county of Kent;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the population of the parish of Sevenoaks, in the county of Kent, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons:

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said parish, held at the Vestry Room of the Church of the parish, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Saturday, the fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, it was resolved,—

"That it is expedient that application be made

"to the Local Government Board for their

"sanction to the appointment of a Vestry

"Clerk."

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said parish have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution:

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, under the authority of the several Statutes in that behalf, hereby order and direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the holding of "Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for "regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks," as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to, and be put in force within, the said parish of Sevenoaks.

ARTICLE II.—An annual salary not exceeding fifty pounds shall be paid to such Vestry Clerk by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish.

ARTICLE III.—The salary of such Vestry Clerk shall be payable from the day on which he commences the performance of his duties up to the day on which he ceases to hold office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual feast days in the year, namely, Lady-day, Midsummer-day, Michaelmas-day, and Christmas-day, and in case he shall die whilst holding such office, the proportion of salary, if any, remaining unpaid at his death shall be paid to his personal representatives.

ARTICLE IV.—Every person appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk in the said parish shall give to the Guardians of the Poor of the Sevenoaks Union, in the said county of Kent, a bond, in the penal sum of two hundred pounds, in the names of himself and two sufficient sureties, not being officers of that Union, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office; and shall give immediate notice to the said Guardians of the death, insolvency, or bankruptcy of either of such sureties, and shall, when required by the said Guardians, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his sureties are alive and believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die, or become bankrupt or insolvent.

Provided that the Guardians may accept as a security the guarantee of any Company or Association which shall undertake to guarantee the good conduct of such officers, and shall give such guarantee in a security, the form whereof shall have been approved by the Poor Law Board or the Local Government Board under their Seal.

ARTICLE V.—The Auditor of the district com-

prising the said Sevenoaks Union shall, in the statement relating to the securities of the officers of the Union, which, under the Orders in that behalf, he is required to transmit to the Local Government Board, include the name of the Vestry Clerk for the said parish of Sevenoaks for the time being appointed under the authority aforesaid, together with the particulars required in the said Orders, and shall report thereon to the Board of Guardians of the said Union, in like manner as therein set forth with reference to the securities of other officers.

ARTICLE VI.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette.
