A ROYAL Decree, dated the 3rd instant, has been published in the Italian Official Gazette, imposing a statistical duty on all foreign merchandise entering Italian territory and on all national or nationalised merchandise sent abroad. The duty is fixed at 10 centesimi per each package of whatever dimensions, per 1000 kilogrammes in the case of loose merchandise, and per head of horses, mules, asses, horned cattle, sheep, goats, and pigs, alive or dead. The duty is not chargeable in cases of temporary importation and exportation of animals for pasture or work, or of corn conveyed to mills for grinding.
