ORDERS issued by the Local Government Board:—

Epsom Union—Carshalton Parish.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Epsom Union, in the county of Surrey:

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Carshalton, in the said Union:

To the Collector of Poor Rates for the said parish:

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the 27th section of an Act passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the better and more effectual ascertaining, assessing, collecting, and levying the Poor Rate, and all other rates and assessments, in the parish of Carshalton, in the county of Surrey, and for the better management of the business and affairs of the said parish, and for other purposes relating thereto," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the inhabitants of the said parish, from time to time, at a public vestry, to be convened and held for that purpose, to nominate and elect, with the consent of the Poor Law Commissioners for England and Wales, a Collector of Poor Rates;

And whereas a Collector of Poor Rates for the said parish has been duly nominated and elected with the approval of the Poor Law Board, in pursuance of the provisions of the above section;

And whereas by a General Order, dated the 14th day of January, 1867, addressed (among others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the Epsom Union, in which the said parish of Carshalton is comprised, the Poor Law Board made regulations prescribing the mode in which the accounts of certain officers, including Collectors of Poor Rates, should be kept;

And whereas by Article 14 of the said Order, it is provided that nothing contained therein relating to a Collector of Poor Rates shall apply to any such Collector appointed under a Local Act by any other authority than the Overseers:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby rescind, so far as regards the parish of Carshalton, the provision above-recited, contained in Article 14 of the said General Order, dated the 14th day of January, 1867:

And We hereby Order that all the other provisions contained in the said recited Order relating to Collectors of Poor Rates, shall, from and after the 29th day of September, 1874, be applicable to every Collector of Poor Rates, and to every Deputy of any such Collector, appointed for the

said parish of Carshalton under the authority of the above-mentioned Local Act.

Brampton Union.—Parish of Brampton.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Brampton Union, in the county of Cumberland, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union: To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the parish of Brampton, in the said Union:

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 23 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, on the application of the Authority of any Rural Sanitary District, by Order, to be published in the London Gazette, or in such other manner as they may direct, invest such Authority with all or any of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority; and that such investment may be made either unconditionally or subject to any conditions to be specified by the Board as to the time, portion of district, or manner during, at, and in which such powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations are to be exercised and attach;

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the Brampton Union, in the county of Cumberland, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union, have applied to the Local Government Board to issue an Order investing them, as such Sanitary Authority, with certain of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as regards the parish of Brampton, in the said Union:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, having duly considered the said application, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, invest the Guardians of the Poor of the Brampton Union, as such Sanitary Authority within such district as aforesaid, from and after the 6th day of October, 1874, with all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority as regards the parish of Brampton, with reference to making bylaws, and otherwise, in respect to the following matters, viz.:—

In respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1858.

In respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 32 of the Local Government Act, 1858, so far as the powers under that section are not already conferred upon the said Sanitary Authority in pursuance of Section 8 of the Public Health Act, 1872, and Section 5 of the Sanitary Act, 1868.

And in respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 44 of the Sanitary Law Amendment Act, 1874.

And We hereby direct the said Guardians to cause this our Order to be published once in some newspaper circulated within their district, before
