Flashing Light near Nidden Village.

THE German Government has given notice, that from the 20th day of October next, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Urbe Calis-hill, near the village of Nidden, Kurisch Nehrung.

Alteration in Light on Point d'Ostro.
