G.C.B., without issue, which happened on or about the 6th day of July last, the title of Baron Panmure became extinct, but that the Earldom of Dalhousie devolved upon George, now Earl of Dalhousie, C.B., Vice-Admiral on the Retired List of Her Majesty's Fleet, as eldest surviving son and heir of John Ramsay, commonly called the Honourable John Ramsay, Lieutenant-General in the Army, deceased, fourth son of George, Earl of Dalhousie, and that, according to the ordinary rules of honour, the brothers and sister of the said George, now Earl of Dalhousie, cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them in case their father, the said John Ramsay, had survived his nephew, the said Fox, Earl of Dalhousie, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Dalhousie, Her Majesty has been pleased to ordain and declare that Colonel Henry Ramsay, C.B., Bengal Staff Corps, Commissioner at Kumaon, North West Provinces Bengal, Lieutenant-Colonel Robert Anderson Ramsay, late Bengal Army, and Anne Finlay Anderson, wife of Colonel David Ewart, late of the Bengal Artillery, the only surviving brothers and sister of the said George, now Earl of Dalhousie, shall henceforth have, hold, and enjoy the same title, place, pre-eminence, and precedence as if their late father, the said John Ramsay, had survived his nephew, the said Fox, late Earl of Dalhousie, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Dalhousie :

And to command that the Royal order and declaration be registered in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

**Fixed Light on South Head, Manukau Harbour.**

THE New Zealand Government has given notice, that from the 1st day of September, 1874, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the south head bluff, Manukau Harbour.

The light is a *fixed* white light, visible from seaward between the bearings of N. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. and E. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.; it is elevated 385 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 26 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The tower, 20 feet high, is situated on the brow of the south head bluff, and bearing E. by S. distance  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles from Paratutai. Position, lat  $37^{\circ} 3' 30''$  S., long:  $174^{\circ} 33' 30''$  E.

NOTE.—Masters of vessels should be cautious in approaching the shoals which extend so far seaward from Manukau Entrance, for although the light may be seen from a long distance seaward in clear weather, in thick or foggy weather its limit of visibility will be greatly lessened.

**Intended Fixed Light on Shantung Promontory.**

THE Engineer Office at Chefoo, has given notice, that the erection of a lighthouse has been

commenced on the Shantung Promontory, from which, when completed, a light will be exhibited.

The light will be a *fixed* light showing *white* to seaward and *red* inshore to the southward and westward (the latter to warn vessels when they approach the coast). It will be elevated 200 feet above the sea, and in clear weather the white light should be seen from a distance of 21 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric or by lenses, of the first order.

The tower will be round, 64 feet high, and built of stone. Position, lat. 37° 24' N., Long. 122° 42' E.

#### *Temporary Light.*

Also, that a temporary *fixed* white light of the sixth order is now exhibited near the above lighthouse, visible between the bearings N.N.E.  $\frac{2}{3}$  E., round by west and south to S.S.E.  $\frac{2}{3}$  E. The light is, from some positions, obscured by a point of the mainland and Alceste Island between S. by E.  $\frac{2}{3}$  E. and S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{3}$  E. It is elevated 160 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 8 miles.
