WHEREAS the Poor Law Commissioners, acting under the authority of "The Poor Law Amendment Act, 1834," and "The Poor Law Amendment Act, 1844," by an Order under their hands and seal, dated the 24th day of April, 1845, combined the following Unions, namely, the Alcester, Banbury, Chipping Norton, Droitwich, Evesham, Foleshill, Northleach, Pershore, Rugby, Shipston-upon-Stour, Solihull, Southam, Stow-on-the-Wold, Stratford-upon-Avon, Warwick, Witney, Woodstock, and Worcester Unions, together with the parishes of Saint Michael and the Holy Trinity, in the city of Coventry and county of the same city, into a district for the audit of accounts, to be termed "The Oxfordshire and Warwickshire Audit District," and thereby ordered and directed that one person should be appointed as the Auditor of the said district ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 22nd day of July, 1847, the said Commissioners added the parish of Edgcott, in the county of Northampton, to the said Banbury Union ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 3rd day of April, 1851, the Poor Law Board added the parish of Brinklow, in the said county of Warwick, to the said Rugby Union ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 8th day of April, 1851, the Poor Law Board added the parish of Bedworth, in the said county of Warwick, to the said Foleshill Union ;

And whereas the Poor Law Board by an Order dated the 9th day of May, 1851, added the parish

of Birmingham, in the county of Warwick, to the said district ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 27th day of February, 1857, the Poor Law Board added the hamlet of Bushwood, in the said county of Warwick, to the said Solihull Union ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 7th day of May, 1868, the Poor Law Board added the Aston, Bromsgrove, Dudley, Kidderminster, King's Norton, Meriden, Nuneaton, Stourbridge, Walsall, and West Bromwich Unions to the said district, and ordered that an annual salary of £738 should be paid to the said Auditor for the performance of his duties, and that the proportions payable in respect of the several unions and parishes in the said district should be those specified in that Order ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 7th day of March, 1874, the Local Government Board ordered that the above-named parishes of Saint Michael and the Holy Trinity, in the city of Coventry and county of the same city, should, on and after the 26th day of that month, be united for the administration of the laws for the relief of the poor and form a union, to be termed the Coventry Union ; and it is expedient that the said Coventry Union should be added to the said district :

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the statutes in that behalf, hereby order that the Coventry Union shall forthwith be added to the Oxfordshire and Warwickshire Audit District, and that the proportion of the above-named annual salary of seven hundred and thirty-eight pounds to be paid to the Auditor of the said district in respect of that union, shall be the same as that heretofore paid in respect of the said parishes of Saint Michael and the Holy Trinity, Coventry, namely, Twenty Pounds :

And whereas by the above-recited Orders dated the 24th day of April, 1845, the 9th day of May, 1851, and the 7th day of May, 1868, the Auditor of the said district is required twice in every year, that is to say, as soon as may be after the 25th day of March and the 29th day of September, to examine, audit, and allow or disallow the accounts of the several unions, and of the parish therein, and of the several parishes comprised in the said unions, according to the laws in force for the time being for the administration of the relief of the Poor :

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby further order that the said Auditor shall, as soon as he can conveniently do so, in respect of the accounts to be rendered up to the twenty-ninth day of September last, and thenceforth in like manner and at the times before mentioned, examine, audit, and allow or disallow the accounts of the Guardians of the Poor of the said Coventry Union, of their several officers, and of the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor, and of all other officers of the said union who are by law liable to account to the said Auditor.

**P**URSUANT to the provisions of the School of Physic Act, 40 Geo. 4th. The Professor shall have the use of the College Laboratory for analyses bearing on Medical Chemistry, and approved by the Provost and Senior Fellows, such as Medical and Medico-legal investigations, and analyses connected with purposes of Public Health.

All Candidates are required to send their names, with the places of their education, the Universities where they have taken their Medical Degrees, and the places where they have practised, to the Registrar of Trinity College, Dublin, and the Registrar of the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland, on or before Saturday, the 23rd January, 1875.
