

The Bankruptcy Act, 1869.

In the County Court of Berkshire, holden at Windsor.
In the Matter of Charles Francis Buller, of Spital Bar-
racks, Windsor, in the county of Berks, a Lieutenant in
Her Majesty's Second Regiment of Life Guards, a
Bankrupt.

UPON reading a report of the Trustee of the prop-
erty of the bankrupt, dated the 10th day of October,

1874, reporting (inter alia) that the whole of the available
property of the bankrupt had been realized for the benefit
of the creditors, the Court being satisfied that the whole of
the available property of the bankrupt has been realized
for the benefit of his creditors, doth order and declare that
the bankruptcy of the said Charles Francis Buller has
closed.—Given under the Seal of this Court this 22nd day
of October, 1874.
