NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 156.)—NORWAY—SOUTH COAST—LAURVIK FIORD.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Svenöer.

THE Norwegian Government has given notice, that from the 22nd October, 1874, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse on Svenöer, entrance of Laurvik Fiord.

The light is a *fixed and flashing* white light showing *two consecutive flashes*, each of *five seconds' duration*, *every two minutes*, elevated 89 feet above the level of the sea, and clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

The lighthouse, built of stone, is painted white, and the lantern red. Position, lat. $58^{\circ} 58' 30''$ N., long. $10^{\circ} 9' 30''$ E.

And, that the beacon hitherto used on the island, would, from the exhibition of the light, be removed.

Alteration in Staværnsö Light.

Also, that the red light on Staværnsö, west side of the entrance of Laurvik Fiord, is exhibited from a new lighthouse, and that the limit of the light is extended to show between the bearings of N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., through west, to S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

KILLS FIORD.

Fixed Red Light at Stafseg.

Also, that from the above date a *fixed red* light would be exhibited at Stafseg, in Kills Fiord, elevated 81 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 7 miles. The illuminating apparatus is of the fifth order. Position, lat. $58^{\circ} 51' 10''$ N., long. $9^{\circ} 27' 40''$ E.

Fixed Red Light at Strömtangen.

Also, that from the same date a *fixed red* light would be exhibited at Strömtangen, near Rabbet Point, west side of entrance to Kills Fiord, visible when bearing from N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. to West. It is elevated 25 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 6 miles. The illuminating apparatus is of the sixth order. Position, lat. $58^{\circ} 50' 30''$ N., long. $9^{\circ} 28' 20''$ E.

These two lights in line lead through the Stangho Channel.

Fog Signal at Jomfruland Lighthouse.

Also, that from the same date a fog trumpet would be established at Jomfruland Lighthouse, which in thick and foggy weather, or in snow storms, will sound *three blasts*, of *five to six seconds' duration* each, *every minute*.

(No. 157.)—CANADA—ST. LAWRENCE RIVER.

(1) Revolving Light on Metis Point.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that from the 20th October, 1874, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Metis Point, St. Lawrence River.

The light is a *revolving* white light, showing a *flash every minute*, elevated 56 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 13 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors.

The tower is square, 40 feet high, and painted white. Position, lat. $48^{\circ} 41' N.$, long. $68^{\circ} 2' 15'' W.$

BAY OF FUNDY—NEW BRUNSWICK.

(2) Fog Signal on Cape Enrage.

Also, that from the same date, a steam fog whistle would be established on Cape Enrage, Chignecto Channel, Bay of Fundy, at a distance of 50 yards north-east of the lighthouse.

In thick or foggy weather and snow storms, the whistle will be sounded in blasts of *eight seconds' duration* in *each minute*, with an interval of *fifty-two seconds* between each blast.

The whistle will probably be heard in calm weather or with the wind, at a distance of 10 miles, and in stormy weather or against the wind, from 3 to 5 miles.

(No. 158.)—STRAIT OF MACASSAR.

Shoal Ground South of Sibaroe Island.

THE Netherlands Government has given notice of the existence of shoal ground near Sibaroe Island, south part of the Strait of Macassar:

The shoal (Trinidad Shoal) is about a mile in breadth. The least depth of water found on it was 26 feet, but, from the colour of the water, it is believed that shoaler spots may exist. The shoal was observed to extend to the N.W. and S.E.—the distances unknown.

The shoal of 26 feet lies S. by W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W., distant four miles from the east point of Sibaroe, or in lat. $5^{\circ} 8' 30''$ S., long. $117^{\circ} 5'$ E.

NOTE.—A passage, in which 27 fathoms has been found, exists between Trinidad Shoal and Sibaroe Island, and vessels can pass it, in safety about two miles from Sibaroe Island.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 1° Easterly in 1874.]

Re-establishment of Light on Cape Palmas.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 78, dated 30th August, 1873, on the discontinuance of the light on Cape Palmas:—

Information has been received that the light is again exhibited, but is of so inferior a character that in clear weather it can be seen only from a distance of 2 to 3 miles.

Light at Cape Mesurado.

Also, that a light is exhibited from a lantern hoisted on a flag-staff about 20 yards south-west of the light tower (which is out of repair), on the summit of Mount Mesurado, about half a mile N. by E. of the Cape.

NOTE.—Caution is required in navigating this coast at night, as the lights are frequently not exhibited, and when lighted are indifferent.

(No. 160.)—MEDITERRANEAN—ADRIATIC—
VEGLIA ISLAND.

(1). *Harbour Light at Bescanuova.*

THE Austrian Government has given notice, that on the 20th October, 1874, a light was exhibited from an iron stand attached to the keeper's dwelling, on Cricin Point, near Bescanuova, south-east end of Veglia Island.

The light is a *fixed green* light, elevated 54 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 6 miles.

Position, lat $44^{\circ} 58'$ N., long. $14^{\circ} 46'$ E.

LESINA ISLAND.

(2). *Temporary Light on San Giorgio Point.*

Also, that on the 14th October, 1874, a temporary light was exhibited upon San Giorgio Point, east point of Lesina Island.

The light is a *fixed white* light, elevated 30 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of about 3 miles.

The light is exhibited from a lantern attached to the eastern side of the Church of Saint Antonio, situate on the extremity of the point. Position, lat. $43^{\circ} 7' 30''$ N., long. $17^{\circ} 12'$ E.

NOTE.—It is possible that during stormy weather this light will not be exhibited.

CANALE DI NARENTA—SABBIONCELLO.

(3). *Fixed Light on Cape Gomena.*

Also, that on the 14th October, 1874, a light was exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Cape Gomena, north-west point of Sabioncello Peninsula.

The light is a *fixed white* light, elevated 79 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses.

The light is exhibited from an iron stand placed on the north-west side of the keeper's dwelling.

The lighthouse, 36 feet high, is situated 190 yards from the extremity of the Cape.

Position, lat. $43^{\circ} 2' 45''$ N., long. $17^{\circ} 0' 15''$ E.
