

ORDERS issued by the Local Government Board under "The Public Health Act, 1872," investing Guardians with Urban Powers:—

Stockton Union.—Stockton-upon-Tees Township.
To the Guardians of the Poor of the Stockton Union, in the county of Durham, and the North Riding of the county of York, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union:
And to all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS by Section 23 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, on the application of the Authority of any Rural Sanitary District, by Order to be published in the London Gazette, or in such other manner as they may direct, invest such Authority with all or any of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority; and that such investment may be made either unconditionally or subject to any conditions to be specified by the Board as to the time, portion of district, or manner during, at, and in which such powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations are to be exercised and attach;

And whereas by an Order, dated the 15th day of July, 1874, the Local Government Board, on the application of the Guardians of the Poor of the Stockton Union, in the county of Durham, and the North Riding of the county of York, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union, invested the said Guardians, as such Authority, with certain of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as regards the parishes of Norton and Yarm, and the townships of Billingham, Cowpen Bewley, Whitton, and Wolviston, in the Rural Sanitary District of the said Union;

And whereas the said Guardians have applied to the Local Government Board to issue an Order investing them, as such Sanitary Authority, with certain of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as regards a part of the Rural Sanitary District of the said Union, namely, that part of the township of Stockton-upon-Tees which is not comprised in the municipal borough of that township:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, having duly considered the said application, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, invest the Guardians of the Poor of the Stockton Union, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, from and after the 18th day of February, 1875, with all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as regards that part of the township of Stockton-upon-Tees which is not comprised in the municipal borough of that township, with reference to making and enforcing bylaws, and otherwise, in respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And We hereby direct the said Guardians to cause this our Order to be published once in some newspaper circulated within the Rural Sanitary District of the said Union, before the expiration of one calendar month from the date hereof.

Conway Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Conway Union, in the counties of Carnarvon and Denbigh, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union:

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 23 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, on the application of the Authority of any Rural Sanitary District, by Order, to be published in the London Gazette, or in such other manner as they may direct, invest such Authority with all or any of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority; and that such investment may be made either unconditionally or subject to any conditions to be specified by the Board as to the time, portion of district, or manner during, at, and in which such powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations are to be exercised and attach;

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the Conway Union, in the counties of Carnarvon and Denbigh, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union, have applied to the Local Government Board to issue an Order investing them, as such Sanitary Authority, with certain of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, having duly considered the said application, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers given by the statutes in that behalf, invest the Guardians of the Poor of the Conway Union, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, from and after the 27th day of February, 1875, with all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, with reference to making and enforcing bylaws, and otherwise, in respect to the following matters, either as regards the whole or a portion of their District as hereinafter specified viz.:—

As regards the whole of the Rural Sanitary District of the said Union;—

With respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 32 of the Local Government Act, 1858, so far as the powers under that section are not already conferred upon the said Sanitary Authority in pursuance of Section 8 of the Public Health Act, 1872, and Section 5 of the Sanitary Act, 1868.

With respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1858:

With respect to bathing, under Section 44 of the Local Government Act, 1858.

With respect to ruinous or dangerous buildings, and to slaughterhouses, under Section 45 of same Act.

And with respect to the regulation of new buildings, under Section 28 of the Local Government Act (1858) Amendment Act, 1861.

As regards the parish of Conway, in the said Rural Sanitary District;—

With respect to the lighting of streets, under Section 8 of the Public Health Supplemental Act, 1849.

And with respect to fires, under Section 44 of the Local Government Act, 1844.

As regards the parish of Conway and the townships of Eirias, Llandrillo-yn-Rhôs, and Lower Llandudno, in the said Rural Sanitary District;—

With respect to hackney carriages, under Section 41 of the Local Government Act, 1858.
