In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 21.)—France—North Coast—Seine RIVER ENTRANCE.

Alteration in Lights at Trouville.

THE French Government has given notice, that from the 1st April, 1875, the following alteration will be made in the lights at Trouville, viz. :-

There will be three lights.

(1.) Deauville.—A fixed red light on the west side of the entrance to Toques River, visible through an arc of 84 degrees or between the bearings of S. by W. and E. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., elevated 62 feet above the high water level, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The tower is 59 feet high, square and painted in alternate red and white bands. Position given, lat. 49° 21′ 50″ N., long. 0° 4′ 40″ E. Position, as

(2.) East Pier.—A fixed green light near the end of the East Pier, and bearing N. by W. 4 W. distant 547 yards from Deauville Light; elevated 33 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 7 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by

lenses, of the fourth order.
(3.) West Pier.—A fixed tidal light from a white iron turret near the end of the West Pier, and bearing W.N.W. distant 86 yards from the East Pier Light. This light shows white seaward when bearing from S.W. by S., through south, east, and north to N. by W. W.; and red when bearing from N. by W. W.; through west to S.W. by S. It is elevated 26 feet above high water, and in clear weather the white light should be seen from a distance of 8 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by

lenses, of the fifth order.

This light will be exhibited only when there is a depth of at least $6\frac{1}{2}$ feet through the whole

length of the channel. Note.—In making for the port, the red light of Deauville in line with the green light of the East

Pier bearing S. by E. & E. will lead through the fairway towards the entrance, but when the white light of the West Pier changes to red, it will be necessary to keep a little to the westward to take the channel between the piers.

The eastern limit of the red light of Deauville passes about two-thirds of a mile westward of the western extremity of the Ratelets, so that while the light is in sight the vessel is clear of that danger.
