By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

And for the better enabling you, Our said Commissioners, to make the said enquiries, We do by these presents authorize and empower you or any five or more of you, to call before you or any five or more of you, such persons as you may judge necessary, by whom you may be the better informed of the matters herein submitted for your consideration and every matter connected therewith, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And also to call for and examine all such books, documents, papers, or records, as you shall judge likely to afford you the fullest information on the subject of this Our Commission, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do further by these presents authorize and empower you or any five or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places in Our United Kingdom as you may deem expedient for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid, and to employ such persons as you may think fit to assist you in conducting any inquiry which you may hold.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you or any five or more of you, do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, upon the matter referred to you as aforesaid, and that you may have power to certify unto Us from time to time your several proceedings in respect of the matter aforesaid if it may seem expedient for you so to do.

And We do further will and command and by these presents ordain, that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, shall and may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And for your assistance in the execution of these presents, We do hereby authorize and empower you to appoint a Secretary to this Our Commission, to attend you, whose services and assistance We require you to use from time to time as occasion may require.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Law of the French Republic, promulgated on the 25th ultimo, modifying the Import and Export Tariff of France and Algeria, as follows :—

ART. 1. Gallic acid manufactured in Corsica is added to the list of products of that Island which enjoy free admission on the French continent. Gallic acid of foreign manufacture imported into Corsica will be subject there to the same régime as on the French continent.

ART. 2. The provisions of Art. 12 of the Law of the 9th February, 1832, will continue to be in force relative to the presentation of goods in transit at bureaux of the 2nd line, and to the visa of the bonds delivered for such goods. The visa at bureaux of the 2nd line will be equally obligatory for permits for goods which have been temporarily admitted.

ART. 3. The Decree of 29th September, 1873, is ratified, by the terms of which the duties on sugar and coffee imported into Algeria are modified as follows :—

Raw sugar, of whatever origin, 20 fr. per 100 kilos.

Refined sugar, of whatever origin, 30 fr. per 100 kilos.

Coffee, 30 fr. per 100 kilos.

ART. 4. The Decree of the 31st July, 1873, is ratified, by the terms of which chocolate and ground cocoa of foreign origin imported into Algeria will pay the general Tariff rates. Chocolate and ground cocoa imported from Algeria into France will be subject to the following duties, décimes included :—

Chocolate, 89 fr. 25 c. per 100 kilos.

Ground cocoa, 116 fr. 66 c. per 100 kilos.

ORDER issued by the Local Government Board investing Guardians with Urban Powers:—

Warrington Union.

Great Sankey and other Townships.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Warrington Union, in the counties of Lancaster and Chester, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union:

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 23 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, on the application of the Authority of any Rural Sanitary District, by Order, to be published in the London Gazette, or in such other manner as they may direct, invest such Authority with all or any of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority; and that such investment may be made either unconditionally or subject to any conditions to be specified by the Board as to the time, portion of district, or manner during, at, and in which such powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations are to be exercised and attach;

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the Warrington Union, in the counties of Lancaster and Chester, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union, have applied to the Local Government Board to issue an Order investing them, as such Sanitary Authority, with certain of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as

regards a portion of their district, namely, the townships of Grappenhall, Great Sankey, Penketh, Poulton-with-Fearnhead, and Thelwall, and so much of the townships of Latchford and Warrington as is not included in the municipal borough of Warrington:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, having duly considered the said application, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, invest the Guardians of the Poor of the Warrington Union, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, from and after the 12th day of April, 1875, with all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as regards the townships of Grappenhall, Great Sankey, Penketh, Poulton-with-Fearnhead, and Thelwall, and so much of the townships of Latchford and Warrington as is not included in the municipal borough of Warrington; with reference to making and enforcing bylaws, and otherwise, with respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 34 of the Local Government Act, 1858, and in Section 44 of the Sanitary Law Amendment Act, 1874.

And We hereby direct the said Guardians to cause this Order to be published once in some newspaper circulated within the said Rural Sanitary District, before the expiration of one calendar month from the date hereof.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 44.)—RUSSIA—WHITE SEA—DWINA RIVER MOUTH.

Lights on South end of Moudiuga Island.

THE Russian Government has given notice, that two lights have been established on the south end of Mudovski or Moudiuga Island, at the north entrance of the Dwina River, replacing the two beacons heretofore used as a leading mark for crossing the Berëzov Bar.

Southern Light is a fixed white light, visible between the bearings of N. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. round by east to S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.; it is elevated 66 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 9 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is of the fourth order.

The tower is situated on a sand hill near the south part of the island, it is 57 feet high, square, built of wood, and painted black. Position, lat. $64^{\circ} 51' N.$, long. $40^{\circ} 19' 40'' E.$

Northern Light lies N.W. 470 yards from the Southern Light; it is a fixed red light, visible between the bearings of S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. and S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., elevated 20 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 5 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is of the sixth order.

The tower, 13 feet high, is built of wood, and painted white. The light is exhibited from a window facing the bar:

Directions.—In entering, when crossing the Berëzov Bar, keep the above lights in line, bearing S.E., and when, by the bearing of the light on the west side of Moudiuga Island, the bar has been passed the vessel may anchor.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation $5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ Easterly in 1875.]

BRITISH COLUMBIA—BURREARD INLET.

Revolving Light on Atkinson Point.

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that on the 1st May, 1875, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on Atkinson Point, the north point of entrance to Burrard Inlet, Strait of Georgia.

The light will be a revolving white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, elevated 119 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 14 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.

The tower, 58 feet high, is a square wooden building, with the keeper's dwelling attached. Position, lat. $49^{\circ} 19' 40'' N.$, long. $123^{\circ} 16' W.$

NOTE.—Vessels navigating in the Strait of Georgia should not bring the light to bear to the westward of North, in order to clear the Sturgeon Bank off Fraser River.

Tees Conservancy.

Power to increase, vary, and alter the present Constitution and Number of Commissioners, to provide for the Representation of Ship-owners and Payers of Dues—the Qualification and Election of Commissioners—the Duration of Office—Nomination of Candidates—Filling up Vacancies—Expenses of Election—Reduction of present Number of Representatives now appointed by the Stockton Town Council and the Middlesbrough Town Council—the Order of Retirement and Re-election of Commissioners—Preparation, &c., of Register of Shipowners—Payers of Dues—As to Scale of Voting—Preparation and Revision of Lists of Voters, &c., and other powers—Amendment of Acts, &c.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament by way of Petition for additional provision for the insertion in a Bill now pending in the Honourable the House of Commons under the above name or short title, and intituled "A Bill for further empowering the Tees Conservancy Commissioners and for amending their Acts, and for other purposes," which proposed additional provision will contain clauses and amendments for carrying into effect, subject to such alterations conditions and modifications as Parliament may think fit, the objects and purposes, or some of the objects and purposes following, that is to say,—

To provide for and authorise the election of additional Commissioners to form part of the body corporate of the Commissioners, to be elected by the several classes in the proportions and manner hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The election of two Commissioners by persons residing in the port of Stockton or within a prescribed distance thereof, and registered in the books of the custom-house of that port as owners or part owners of vessels registered as belonging to that port (hereafter referred to as "Stockton shipowners").

The election of two Commissioners by persons residing in the port of Middlesbrough or within a prescribed distance thereof, and registered in the books of the custom-house of that port as owners or part owners of vessels registered as belonging to that port (hereafter referred to as "Middlesbrough shipowners").

The election of two Commissioners by persons residing, or carrying on business, within the port of Stockton, or within a prescribed distance thereof, and paying within that port any money in respect of certain dues, leviable under the Tees Conservancy Act, 1867, and directed to be carried to the Tees Conservancy Revenue Account (which dues and persons are herein referred to as "Tees dues," and as "Stockton payers of Tees dues.")

The election of two Commissioners by persons residing, or carrying on business, within the port of Middlesbrough, or within a prescribed distance thereof, and paying within that port any money in respect of Tees dues (which persons are herein referred to as "Middlesbrough payers of Tees dues.")

To require the collectors of customs of the ports of Stockton and Middlesbrough to make lists of the registered shipowners, with the respective names and registered tonnage of the vessels in respect of which such owners are registered.

To provide, fix, and regulate the scale of voting for registered shipowners.

To require the Commissioners to make a register, for each of the said two ports, of the payers of Tees dues.

To provide, fix, and regulate the scale of voting for payers of Tees dues, and the making up of lists of persons entitled to vote as Stockton and Middlesbrough payers of Tees dues respectively, with the number of votes to which they are respectively entitled, and the posting and keeping of such lists for public inspection.

To provide for the appointment of revisers of the lists of electors; the yearly revising of such lists; the claims of persons to be entered on the lists; the correction of errors, and objections to persons claiming votes to which they are not entitled.

To provide for the correction and signing of such lists, the custody thereof, and the production by the Commissioners of books, &c. to revisers; what shall be evidence of revised lists; the continuance of such lists, and printing and publishing of same.

Providing for the holding of meetings for the election of Commissioners; procedure at meetings; printing of lists of persons qualified to vote; qualification of Commissioners; the determination of elections by majority of votes; results to be communicated to Chief Clerk to Commissioners; the duration of office of elected Commissioners; the nomination of candidates; the filling up of vacancies, and expenses of elections.

To provide for the reduction of the present number, and for the future appointment of representatives of the respective Councils of the Boroughs of Stockton and Middlesbrough, and to fix and determine that on and after the 9th day of November, 1875, the full number of the representatives of the respective Councils shall be four instead of 5:

That on and after the said 9th day of November, 1875, two but no more of the then representatives of the respective Councils shall remain in office:

That on that day the respective Councils shall appoint two representatives in addition to the two so remaining in office: and that on that day one but not more of the then representatives of the ratepayers of Yarm shall remain in office and that on that day such ratepayers shall appoint one representative in addition to the one remaining in office.

To make other provision for alteration in the constitution of the body corporate of the Commissioners, and in the mode of the appointment, election, and retirement of the Commissioners and that subject to the provisions of the intended Act, the provisions contained in "The Tees Conservancy and Stockton Dock Act, 1852," and any Act amending the same, relative to the appointment and election of Commissioners by the Stockton Council, and by the Middlesbrough Council, and by the Yarm ratepayers, respectively, shall continue to operate as nearly as may be in all respects as if the said intended Act had not been passed.

And, so far as may be necessary or expedient, to repeal, alter, or amend the provisions or some of the provisions of "The Tees Conservancy and Stockton Dock Act, 1852," "The Tees Conservancy Act, 1854," "The Tees Conservancy Act, 1858," "The Tees Conservancy Act, 1863," and "The Tees Conservancy Act, 1867."

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Dewsbury, Batley, and Birstal Tramways Company Limited, under the powers conferred on the Company by the Tramways Act, 1870—

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make bye-laws or regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation, shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws and regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of a conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Company, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended for only such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage,

or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage or travel therein, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

16. When any carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

17. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

18. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request for the purpose by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

20. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Company with loaded fire-arms.

21. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty, upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.

22. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these bye-laws and regulations to the best of his ability.

23. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws or regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

24. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company and having charge of a carriage.

25. There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these bye-laws and regulations.

26. These bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1875.
