Warsaw, Decemb. 24.

THE 21 instant the Deputies that compose the Dyer were in the usual manner presented to the King by their Marshal or Speaker; after which they returned to the place of their Meeting, to take into consideration the publick Affairs, in which they proceed slowly, because the Deputies are not yet arrived from *Lithuania*. The Letters from *Lemburg* tell us that the Tartars continued to draw together in the Country of *Budziac*; in order to make incursions into the Frontier Provinces of this Kingdom; but that the overflowings of the Rivers, occasioned by the great Rains; did hinder the execution of their design. We have advice that the Kam of *Tartary* being informed of the death of the Prince or *Hospodar* of *Valachia*, had resolved to enter into that Country with a great Body of Men, on pretence of assisting the States thereof against the Germans, but that the new *Hospodar* had sent Deputies to him with rich Presents, to endeavour to stop his march by representing to him that they had no need of any Succors.

Venice, Jan. 1. The Princess of *Bavaria* arrived the 24th past at *Bologna*, where she will remain till the 13th of this month, and then continue her Journey towards *Florence*. Signior *Cornaro* Proveditor-General of *Dalmatia*, has written to the Senate to desire leave to return hither. A great Convoy is ready to sail with the first favourable weather for the *Levant*.

Vienna, Jan. 6. We have an Account from *Bosnia*, that some of the Imperial Troops that are quartered on that side, had, with the help of 2000 Rascians, surprized a place, whither 1500 Turks were retired, the greatest part of which were kill'd, and the rest taken Prisoners, and many Christian Slaves released. The last Letters from *Transylvania* tell us, that the Count de *Veterani* had posted his Troops in divers Passages, and particularly in those towards the Mountains, to secure that Country against the Incursions of the Tartars. We are still expecting the *Seur Proski* from *Poland*, upon whose arrival a Treaty will be begun with the Turkish Ambassadors. The Duke of *Lorraine* is expected here very suddenly from *Inspruck*, being to command the Imperial Army on the *Rhine*.

Rainbonne, Jan. 8. The third instant arrived here a Gentleman from the Duke of *Wirtemberg*, to acquaint the Diet, that the French had,

on the 30th past, possessed themselves by force of the Town of *Saugard*, the place of his usual Residence: And the same day Expresses were dispatched with the News thereof to the Elector of *Saxony*; And to Prince *Louis* of *Baden*, who is now at the Court of *Bavaria*. The Prince of *Dietrichstein*, Great Master of the Emperor's Household, is come hither to take his Place in the College of the Princes.

Paris, Jan. 22. We have advice, that two French Men of War had, on the 20th of the last Month, taken, between *Messina* and *Leghorne*, two Dutch Ships, the one a Man of War, and the other a Merchant Ship richly Laden with Silk and other Merchandises from *Alexandria*: The Merchant Ship fell presently into their hands, but the Man of War made a very vigorous Resistance for several Hours, and had lost all his Masts before he was taken: The French Ships were likewise so shattered, that they were forced to put into the first Port to rest. The Province of *Languedoc* has, we hear, suffered very much by a violent Storm, which has beaten down divers Steeples, overthrown a great many Houses, and pluck'd up a vast number of Trees by the Roots. The Marquis de *Sanguelay*, and the Ingenier *Vauban*, will part from hence the next week to visit the Ports of this Kingdom. There is much discourse of a War between this Crown and *Portugal*.
