Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

### THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

#### SOUTHAMPTON (TRINITY) FAIR.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Richard Assheton Cross, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. By Memorial, dated the 15th day of April, 1875, a representation has been duly made to me by the Town Council of Southampton, as owners, that a Fair has been annually held in the parish of Southampton, in the Southampton Petty Sessional division of the county of Hants, beginning at noon on the Saturday immediately before Trinity Sunday, and continued on the Monday and until the evening of the Tuesday next following, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be held on a less number of days than those on which such Fair is heretofore used to be held, and that of the days above mentioned on which such Fair has been used to be held, such Fair should cease to be held on any portion of the Saturday and on the Tuesday, and should be held on Trinity Monday, and on that day only.

2. On the 21st day of May, 1875, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the said proposed alteration in the time for holding said Fair.

ORDER issued by the Local Government Board under "The Public Health Act, 1872," investing Guardians with Urban Powers:—

#### Newton Abbot Union.

Chudleigh and Highweek Parishes.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Newton Abbot Union, in the county of Devon, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union: And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 23 of the Public Health Act, 1872, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, on the application of the Authority of any Rural Sanitary District, by Order, to be published in the London Gazette, or in such other manner as they may direct, invest such Authority with all or any of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority; and that such investment may be made either unconditionally or subject to any conditions to be specified by the Board as to the time, portion of district, or manner during, at, and in which such powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations are to be exercised and attach;

And whereas the Guardians of the Poor of the Newton Abbot Union, in the county of Devon, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union, have applied to the Local Government Board to issue an Order investing them, as such Sanitary Authority, with certain of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as regards the

parishes of Chudleigh and Highweek, both in the Rural Sanitary District of that Union:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, having duly considered the said application, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers given by the Statutes in that behalf, invest the Guardians of the Poor of the Newton Abbot Union, as such Sanitary Authority as aforesaid, from and after the 6th day of May, 1875, with all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Sanitary Authority, as regards the parishes of Chudleigh and Highweek, with reference to making and enforcing bylaws, and otherwise, with respect to the following matters, viz.:—

With respect to the various matters mentioned in Section 32 of the Local Government Act, 1858, so far as the powers under that section are not already conferred upon the said Sanitary Authority in pursuance of Section 8 of the Public Health Act, 1872, and Section 5 of the Sanitary Act, 1868.

And with respect to slaughterhouses, under Section 45 of the Local Government Act, 1858.

And We hereby direct the said Guardians to cause this Order to be published once in some newspaper circulated within the said Rural Sanitary District, before the expiration of one calendar month from the date hereof.

Metropolitan Board of Works (Various Powers) Bill.

(Additional Provisions authorising—1st. Alterations in Powers granted by "The Metropolitan Board of Works Act, 1874," in respect of the Finsbury Park, and the making of New Roads in substitution of part of authorised Road. 2nd. Vesting in Middlesex Justices land fronting the Clerkenwell Sessions House, and consequent alteration of Works authorised by, and amendment of, the Metropolitan Street Improvements Act, 1872. 3rd. Enabling the two Societies of the Inner and Middle Temple to extend their line of frontage in making improvement at Harcourt and Plowden Buildings beyond line authorised by the 28th Section of "The Thames Embankment Act, 1862.")

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Metropolitan Board of Works (who are herein referred to as "The Board") are applying to Parliament in the present session for leave to introduce into the Metropolitan Board of Works (Various Powers) Bill, now referred to a Select Committee of the Honourable the House of Commons, all such powers as may be necessary for effecting the following or some of the following objects:

#### Finsbury Park.

1. To repeal in part and otherwise to amend the provisions or some of the provisions of the Metropolitan Board of Works Act, 1874, relating to the new road authorised and the powers conferred by that Act with reference to such road.

2. To authorise the abandonment of so much of the new road at Finsbury Park authorised by the said Act of 1874, as is situate in the parish of Hornsey, in the county of Middlesex, between the authorised commencement of the said road in the Seven Sisters'-road and the existing road bridge over the Great Northern Railway on the west side of Finsbury Park.

3. To enable the Board to construct in the said parish of Hornsey the following substituted roads :

(1.) A road about 480 yards long, commencing at the aforesaid bridge over the Great Northern Railway, passing in a south-westerly direction under an existing bridge of the Great Northern Railway (Edgware, Highgate, and London line), and terminating at the north-east end of Upper Tollington Park-road.

(2.) A road about 460 yards in length, commencing at the north-eastern end of Stapleton Hall-road, passing in a north-easterly direction under an existing bridge of the said Edgware, Highgate, and London Railway, and over the tunnel of the Tottenham and Hampstead Junction Railway, at the same point, being the point at which the aforesaid railways cross each other, and terminating at a point about 200 yards to the north-east of the aforesaid bridge.

4. To declare that such new roads shall be public highways, and be maintained for eight years after their completion and opening to the public by the Board, and afterwards by the Hornsey Local Board.

5. To confirm or to carry out, in and by the Bill, the terms and conditions which have been agreed upon between the Board and the said Local Board, and the landowners and others interested in the matter, touching the said substituted roads, and the powers to be applied for from Parliament in respect thereof.

#### Clerkenwell Sessions House.

6. To authorise the Board and the Justices of the Peace for the county of Middlesex to carry out by and under the provisions to be inserted in the Bill, an arrangement made between them for the purchase by and transfer to the said Justices, of land in the parish of St. John, Clerkenwell, fronting the Sessions House, at Clerkenwell Green, consisting of about 3,020 feet superficial in extent (and which land, by the Metropolitan Street Improvements Act, 1872, was authorized to be acquired by or utilised by the Board), for the purposes of that Act, and to vest same in the said Justices with the power to enclose and to make it part of the Sessions House premises.
