Board of Trade (Horbour Department), Whitehall Gardens, July 22, 1875.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Notice issued by the Egyptian Board of Health to the effect that, in consequence of cholera in Syria, arrivals from the Syrian coast as far as and including Alexandretta will without exception be subjected to a ten days' quarantine with disembarkation at a lazaretto.

Passengers' quarantine can only be accomplished at the lazaretto of Gabaii, at Alexandretta, or, if those concerned prefer it, at that of Esbet, at Damietta, but at their own risk as regards disembarkation.

Arrivals from Syria by land will also be subjected to the same length of quarantine to be accomplished at El Arich.

Board of Trade (Harbour Department), Whitehall Gardens, July 22, 1875.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of Notice issued by the Sanitary Authority at Smyrna to the effect that arrivals from the coast of Syria, including Alexandretta, which left on or after the 5th instant, will be subjected to quarantine at Smyrna on account of cholera.

Board of '1 rade (Harbour Department), Whitehall Gardens, July 22, 1875.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs an intimation that in consequence of the tendency of the outbreak of Asiatic cholera in Syria to spread, and of the disease having appeared on the sea coast, the Constantinople Board of Health have decided to apply the quarantine rules to all arrivals from the seaboard of Syria, extending from Alex-

andretta to Saida, which have left that country since the 5th instant.

It is further announced that the plague has disappeared from Mesopotamia; and that in consequence of cholera having appeared in Bombay and its environs arrivals thence will be subjected to medical inspection at Bussorah before being admitted to free pratique.
