III.—LIABILITIES OF THE COMMISSION.

The liabilities of the Commission comprised on the 31st December, the following debts:—

- 1st. The remainder of the loan concluded with the house of Bischoffsheim and Goldschmidt.
- 2nd. The amounts due to Turkey on account of the advances made up to 1863, and on account-current.
- 3rd. The sums borrowed temporarily from the Reserve and Retiring Funds, and employed in the ordinary service.

FIRST.—4 per Cent. Loan, Bischoffsheim and Goldschmidt.

The loan of £135,000, concluded with this bank in the year 1868, is repayable in annuities, whereof the total, including the interests, amounts to £170,901 $\frac{52}{100}$. By the payment of £43,200 effected in 1871, 1872, and 1873, this debt was reduced to £127,701 $\frac{52}{100}$, viz. :—

SECOND.—Debt to the Sublime Porte.

The total of this debt amounted on the 31st December, 1874, to 4,043,712 francs 63 cts. composed of—

1st. The principal capital of 3,739,540 francs, producing interest at 4 per cent. per annum from the 1st January, 1871.

2nd. And of the balance of 304,172 francs, 63 cts., which results from the account-current, kept separately. This account-current is credited with the interest produced by the principal capital, and debited with the payments made by the Commission on account of the Ottoman Government, such as the salaries of the Staff of the General Inspection at Toulcha, and of the Captain of the Port of Sulina, &c., &c.

The principal capital is repayable in annuities of 180,000 francs at least, to be met half-yearly, commencing from the 30th June, 1883. The balance of the account-current is to be amortized on the same terms, after the complete amortization of the principal debt,

ORDER issued by the Local Government Board under "The Public Health Act, 1872."—Sanitary: Division into Wards: Consent to Adoption.

Northwich Union.—District of Winsford.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Northwich Union, in the county of Chester, being the Rural Sanitary Authority for that Union:

To Edmund Leigh, of Over, Winsford, in the same county, Esquire:

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by an Order dated the 22nd day of January, 1875, the Local Government Board ordered that, from and after the date thereof, a district, to be called the Winsford District, should be formed, which should comprise the townships of Over and Wharton, both in the county of Chester, and appointed Edmund Leigh, of Over aforesaid, Esquire, to be Summoning Officer under the provisions of Section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1858, to take such steps as might be necessary for convening a meeting to decide as to the adoption of the said Act within the said district;

And whereas at a public meeting of the owners and ratepayers of the Winsford District, held, after due notice, on the 17th day of February, 1875, the Local Government Act, 1858, was adopted in the said district, and notice of such adoption has been given in writing to the Local Government Board by the person required to give the same;

And whereas by Section 24 of the above-mentioned Act it is enacted (inter alia) that "in districts where this Act is adopted the owners and ratepayers may by resolution direct a petition to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to divide the districts into wards for the purpose of election of the Local Board, and to declare what proportion of the members of the Local Board shall be elected by each ward; and the said Secretary of State may by his Order make such division and declaration, after such inquiry, as he shall deem necessary, and fourteen days' notice shall be given of the time, place, and object of such inquiry;"

And whereas by the Local Government Board Act, 1871, all powers and duties vested in or imposed on one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State by the first above-recited Act have been transferred to and imposed on the Local Government Board;

And whereas at another public meeting of owners and ratepayers in the said district, held, after due notice, on the 9th day of April, 1875, it was determined that the Winsford Local Board should consist of twelve members, and it was resolved that a petition be presented to the Local Government Board, praying them to divide the said district into wards, for the purpose of the election of the Local Board, and to declare what proportion of the members of the Local Board shall be elected by each ward;

And whereas a petition was presented to the Local Government Board accordingly, and upon

receipt thereof, the Local Government Board directed an inquiry to be made on the subject, and such inquiry has been held, after due notice, and report has been made to them thereon:

Now, therefore, we, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given by the several Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows; viz. :—

I. The said Winsford District shall, for the purposes of the Election of a Local Board under the Local Government Act, 1858, be divided into Four Wards, to be termed respectively,

The Vale Royal Ward,
The Swanlow Ward,
The Gravel Ward, and
The Wharton Ward,

which Wards shall comprise the parts of the said District described in the Schedule hereto.

II. Three of the Members of the Local Board shall be elected for each of the Four Wards hereby constituted.

And in pursuance of Section 25 of the Public Health Act, 1872, and Section 20 of the Local Government Act, 1858, we hereby consent to the adoption of the Local Government Act, 1858, in the said Winsford District, and Order that the last-mentioned Act shall have the force of law within the said District, from the fifteenth day after the date of this Order.

The SCHEDULE above referred to.

The Vale Royal Ward shall comprise all such parts of the township of Over as are on the north side of an imaginary line which starting from the centre of Winsford Bridge, follows in a westerly direction the centre of Over-lane to the Four-lane ends; thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Hebden-lane to the stile behind the Village of Over; thence in a north-westerly direction along the stile road behind the said the village to a point in the centre of Littler Lane-road, opposite Littler Farm; thence in a north-easterly direction along the said Littler Lane-road to the centre of the road leading from Over to Chester-lane end; and thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the said road leading from Over to Chester-lane end to the boundary of the township of Over.

The Swanlow Ward shall comprise all such parts of the township of Over as are not included in the Vale Royal Ward.

The Gravel Ward shall comprise all such parts of the township of Wharton as are on the southerly side of an imaginary line which, starting from the centre of Winsford Bridge, follows in an easterly direction along the centre of the road leading from Winsford Bridge to Wharton Church to the centre of Crook-lane; thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Crook-lane to the centre of Gravel-lane; thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Gravel-lane to the boundary of the township of Wharton.

The Wharton Ward shall comprise all those parts of the township of Wharton which are not included in the Gravel Ward.
