WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of certain freehold messuages and hereditaments, which are about to be permanently secured to the vicarage of Saint Stephen, Nottingham, in the town and county of the town of Nottingham, and in the diocese of Lincoln, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant to the Incumbent of the said vicarage of Saint Stephen, Nottingham, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, to meet the said benefaction, one yearly sum or stipend of twenty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year.
