THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs copies of Notices issued by the Portuguese authorities at Lisbon, stating that the Arabian ports in the Red Sea, which were considered infected with plague, have passed to the category of suspected of the same disease since the 1st June last, and that the port of Aracajú has been declared free from yellow fever since 1st May last.
