Board of Trade, 1, Whitehall, October 21, 1875.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a new Swedish Customs' Tariff, to come into operation on the 1st of January next. As com-

pared with the existing Tariff Her Majesty's Minister at Stockholm reports the following alterations:—

Duties repealed—On printing type (10 öre per lb.); "other Swedish books" (15 öre per lb.); certain kinds of used furniture (10 per cent. ad valorem); rice in grain (2 öre per lb.); rice flour (4 öre per lb.); fresh vegetables (50 öre per centner); scientific instruments, &c. (15 öre per lb.); hammers, anvils, &c. (25 öre per centner); vegetable meal (12 öre per lb.); shoes and half shoes (50 öre per pair); sulphuric acid (50 öre per centner); unenumerated tools and implements of all kinds.

Duties reduced—On sole leather from 10 öre to 6 öre per lb.; porter from 40 to 30 öre per kanna; pins from 25 to 20 öre per lb.; coloured paper from 4 to 2 öre per lb.; gold watches of "any other kind" from 1 krona to 50 öre per watch; two wheeled carriages from 20 to 15 kronor per carriage.

Duty raised—On four wheeled carriages (*Tril-lor*) from 20 to 25 kronor per carriage.

The duty on silk handkerchiefs (krona 1.50 per lb.) has been assimilated to that on wearing apparel.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a translation of a Decree of the Government of Nicaragua, increasing by 5 per cent. the duties on all merchandise imported into the Republic. The Decree is to take effect from the 1st November next.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 145.)—NORTH SEA—NETHERLANDS.

(1.) *Alteration in Light at Scheveningen.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 11, dated 15th January, 1875, on the intended exhibition of the light at Scheveningen from a new building, and the exhibition of a temporary light:—

The Netherlands Government has given further notice, that towards the end of November, or in the beginning of December, 1875, the new light will be exhibited.

The light will be a *revolving red and white* light, showing a flash alternately red and white *every half minute*, elevated 157 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 18 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric or by lenses, of the second order.

The tower is built of iron, and painted dark brown. Position, lat. $52^{\circ} 6' 20''$ N., long. $4^{\circ} 16' 10''$ E.

Also, that on the new light being exhibited the temporary light will be discontinued.

And that notice will be given of the exact date on which the change will be effected.

NORWAY, WEST COAST.

(2.) *Red and White Light on Nyholm Island.*

The Norwegian Government has given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse on the eastern point of the Island of Nyholm, and which will be exhibited from the 15th August in one year to the 30th April in the next.

The light is a *fixed red and white* light; thus,—

1. In Western Channel.—*White* between the bearings of N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. and E. by N., and *red* from E. by N. to East, when it is hidden by Hiertö.

2. In Northern Channel.—*White* between Hiertö and the mainland, or between the bearings of S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. and S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

The light shows white towards the anchorage.

The light is elevated 62 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 8 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is of the sixth order.

The tower is built of stone. Position, lat. $67^{\circ} 17' N.$, long. $14^{\circ} 24' E.$

(3.) *Flashing Light on Halten Island.*

Also, that on the 1st October, 1875, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse on Halten Island.

The light is a *flashing* light, showing a flash *every four seconds*, elevated 127 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 17 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is of the second order.

The tower is built of white stone. Position, lat. $64^{\circ} 10' N.$, long. $9^{\circ} 27' 30'' E.$

This light will be exhibited the 1st August in one year to the 15th May in the next year.

BALTIC SEA—KIEL FIORD.

(4.) *Fog Signal at Bülk Lighthouse.*

The German Government has given notice, that in October, 1875, a fog signal would be established in front of the lighthouse of Bülk, west point of the entrance to Kiel Fiord, 31 feet above the sea.

The signal apparatus consists of a first class siren trumpet, which in thick or foggy weather will be sounded for *five seconds*, with intervals of *forty seconds*.

Information has been received from the Customs Department at Shanghai that no light is exhibited on Teng-chau Bluff, or from any position near it. The Notice is therefore cancelled, as the authority on which it was issued is thus shown to be in error.

COCHIN CHINA.

(2.) *Rock off Cape Ti-wan (Pernambuco Rock).*

With reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 124, dated 8th September, 1875, on the existence of a sunken rock lying in a south-easterly direction from Cape Ti-wan, and on which the ship "Pernambuco" struck:—

The following additional information, resulting from an examination of the danger by the French ship of war "Surcouf," has been received, viz.:—

The depth of water on the rock at low-water springs is 8 feet. From the rock, Cape Ti-wan bears N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. distant 2 miles, and Cape St. James Lighthouse, W. $\frac{3}{4}$ S.

These bearings place the rock in lat. $10^{\circ} 21' N.$, long. $107^{\circ} 16' 10'' E.$

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 2° Easterly in 1875.]

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as Next of Kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—EFFECTS, 1873-4.

WHEREAS by Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, the Local Authority of any district in which any tramway is laid down is empowered, subject to the approval of the Board of Trade, to make certain regulations as to such tramways, and for enforcing the observance of all or any of such regulations, to make bye-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the first part of such section, provided that such bye-laws be not repugnant to the laws of that part of the United Kingdom where the same are to have effect. And by Section 47 of the same Act it is enacted that any such bye-laws may impose reasonable penalties for offences against the same, not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, with or without further penalties for continuing offences, not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for each day during which the offence continues; but that all bye-laws shall be so framed so as to allow in every case part only of the maximum penalty being ordered to be paid.

And whereas the said Company have constructed tramways as authorized by the said Act, and commenced to use tramway carriages on all tramways so constructed.

Now, in pursuance of the powers given by the said Acts, and of every other power enabling them thereto, and subject to the approval of the Board of Trade, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough, acting by the Council of the said borough as the Local Authority of such borough, make and ordain under their common seal hereto annexed the following bye-laws, namely,—

The expression "carriages" or "carriage" in these bye-laws shall respectively mean carriages or carriage with flanged wheels, or wheels suitable only to run on rails, and used on the tramway; and the expression "Company" shall mean the Leicester Tramways Company Limited, or other the proprietors for the time being of the said tramways.

1. The carriages of the Company shall be driven at a rate not less than five miles; and not more than eight miles in the hour.

2. No carriage shall follow a preceding carriage at a less distance than eighty yards along any portion of the line of tramway (sidings excepted). For any offence against this and the preceding bye-law the driver of the carriage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

These bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1875.

BYE-LAWS and Regulations made by the Corporation of the Borough of Leicester as the Local Authority of the said Borough at a Quarterly Meeting of the Council, held the 28th September, 1875, under the Powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Public Health Act, 1875.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Tramways Act, 1870, the Local Authority of any district in which any tramway is laid down has the same power of making and enforcing

rules and regulations, and of granting licences with respect to all carriages using the tramways, and to all drivers, conductors, and other persons having charge of, or using the same, and to the standings of the same, as they have with respect to hackney carriages and the drivers and other persons having the charge thereof, and to the standings for the same, in the streets and district of or under the control of the Local Authority.

And whereas by Section 3 of the said Act the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Leicester, acting by the Council, are the Local Authority of the said borough.

And whereas, by Section 58 of the Towns' Police Clauses Act, 1847 (incorporated with the Public Health Act, 1875), the said Local Authority are empowered, subject to the confirmation of the Local Government Board, to make certain bye-laws for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and among others for regulating the conduct of the proprietors and drivers of hackney carriages and determining whether such drivers shall wear any and what badges, and also for regulating the manner in which the number of each carriage corresponding with the number of its licence shall be displayed, and also for regulating the number of persons to be carried by such hackney carriage, and in what manner such number is to be shown on such hackney carriage.

And whereas, by Section 183 of the said Public Health Act, 1875, any Local Authority may, by any bye-laws made by them under the said Act, impose on offenders against the same such reasonable penalties as they think fit, not exceeding the sum of five pounds for each offence; and in case of a continuing offence a further penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each day after written notice of the offence from the Local Authority; but all such bye-laws comprising any penalties shall be so framed as to allow of the recovery of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty.

And whereas, by the Tramways Order Confirmation Act, 1873, the Leicester Tramways Company Limited, were authorized to construct certain tramways within the said borough and in certain adjoining parishes.

And whereas, the said Company have constructed tramways as authorized by the said Acts, and commenced to use tramway carriages on all tramways so constructed.

Now, in pursuance of the powers given by the said Acts, and of every other power enabling them thereto, and subject to the confirmation by the Local Government Board, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said borough, acting by the Council thereof as the Local Authority of the said borough, do make and ordain under their common seal hereto annexed, the following bye-laws, namely:—

The expression "carriages" or "carriage" in these bye-laws shall respectively mean carriages or a carriage with flanged wheels, or wheels suitable to run on rails, and used on the said tramways; and the expression "Company" shall mean the Leicester Tramway Company Limited, or other the proprietors for the time being of the said tramways.

1. Every carriage shall have painted on or affixed to each end of the carriage and both inside and outside thereof on a plate, or in some other manner to be approved by an officer of the Corporation duly authorized in this behalf, the number of such carriage corresponding with the number of its licence, and also the maximum number of passengers which such carriage is constructed to carry, and in determining such maximum number

there shall be allowed for each passenger a space of not less than sixteen inches.

Whenever there shall be any passenger or passengers in or upon any carriage in excess of the number determined as aforesaid which such carriage is constructed to carry, the conductor of such carriage shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings; and if any carriage shall ply for hire without having the number of the licence of such carriage and the maximum number of passengers which such carriage is constructed to carry so painted or affixed as aforesaid, the Company shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, and to a further penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day that such carriage shall so ply after written notice to the Company of such offence.

2. The Company shall pay to the Borough Accountant for the time being the sum of two shillings for every carriage licence granted to the Company.

3. Every driver and every conductor of a carriage shall conduct himself in an orderly and respectful manner, and shall at all times wear a badge, to be provided by the Company, in an exposed position, bearing the number of his licence plainly marked thereon. In default he shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings, and to a further penalty not exceeding five shillings for every day during which default continues, after a written notice to him of the offence.

The conductor of each carriage shall carry with him a copy of all bye-laws for the time being in force in respect of the tramways, and shall, on request of any passenger, produce the same to, and permit the same to be perused by, such passenger, and the Company shall affix and keep affixed in each of their offices and waiting-rooms within the borough, a printed copy of such bye-laws for the use of the public. In default the conductor or the Company shall respectively be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, and with respect to the latter offence the Company shall be liable to a further penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which such default continues, after written notice to him or them of the offence.

The Company shall keep and provide such artificial light, both inside and outside the carriages, and during such hours as the Corporation may from time to time determine, as necessary for the efficient lighting of the carriages, and in default the Company shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, and to a further penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day which such default continues, after written notice to them of the offence.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindmost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while riding in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws and regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from mounting any carriage, and shall not mount any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found upon any carriage shall, on request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Company, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use, or attempt to use, any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers, nor travel by any car set apart for their use.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

13. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, not being an official of the Company, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage.

14. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person, not being an official of the Company, shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any

such carriage, when warned by the conductor not to do so.

15. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

16. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage. Any dog or other animal found in or on any carriage in breach of this regulation, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately, upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

17. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Company with loaded fire-arms.

18. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty, upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.

19. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these bye-laws and regulations to the best of his ability.

20. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws or regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

21. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant of the Company.

22. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these bye-laws and regulations.

23. These bye-laws shall come into force on the 20th day of December, 1875.
