NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 151.)—MEDITERRANEAN—ALGERIA.

(1.) *Alteration in Harbour Light at Bougie.*

THE French Government has given notice, that from the 15th October, 1875, the following alteration would be made in the harbour light at Bougie; viz. :—

A light would be exhibited from a small house on the extremity of Abd-el-Kader Pier.

The light is a *fixed red* light elevated 23 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 3 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors.

Also, that on the exhibition of the above light, the light hitherto exhibited from Abd-el-Kader Fort would be discontinued.

CORSICA—BASTIA.

(2.) *Alteration in St. Nicholas Light.*

Also, that from the 15th October, 1875, the following alteration would be made in the colour of the temporary light marking the extremity of the pier in course of construction at Port St. Nicholas, Bastia, viz. :—

The colour would be changed from white to *red*, in order to distinguish it from the lights of the town. In clear weather the light should be seen from a distance of 4 miles.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 152.)—GULF OF BOTHNIA.—SKAL GRUND ISLAND.

(1.) *Fixed and Flashing Light at Kaskö.*

THE Russian Government has given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at Kaskö, Skal Grund Island.

The light is a *fixed and flashing red* light, the flash being seen *every thirty seconds*, it is elevated 103 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 16 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the third order.

The lighthouse, 86 feet high, is round and painted white; the wall surrounding it is red. Position, lat. 62° 20' N., long. 21° 11' E.

(2.) *Beacon Vessel near Uleaborg.*

Also, that a beacon vessel has been moored in the channel between Karlö Island and the shoal of Veli Kelmi, in 4½ fathoms water, and W. ¾ N. from the lighthouse of Uleaborg. The vessel is painted red, and has the name *Portprick* (harbour beacon) on her sides. She has one mast, carries a small red ball at the masthead 38 feet high, and should be seen from a distance of about 7 miles.
