#### Proof of Gun Barrels.

NOTICE is hereby given, pursuant to section 117 of the Gun Barrel Proof Act, 1868, that the Gunmakers' Company of London and the Guardians of the Birmingham Proof House, acting under the authority of the said Act, have,

with the approval of the Right Honourable Gathorne Hardy, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department, repealed and altered certain of the Rules and Regulations stated in Schedule B to the said Act annexed, and, in lieu thereof, have made certain New Rules and Regulations, of which the following is a copy, that is to say :--

Whereas in and by section 117 of the Gun Barrel Proof Act, 1868, the Gunmakers' Company and the Guardians of the Birmingham Proof House, in such Act and hereinafter referred to as "the two Companies," are empowered, should they deem the Proof or the Rules, Regulations, and Scales stated in Schedule B to the said Act annexed, or any of them, respectively, insufficient or inapplicable or unsuitable, on application to, and with the approval of, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department, to repeal or alter all or any of the Rules and Regulations, and all or any part of the scales, respectively, from time to time, in force under the said Act, for the proof of small arms, or of any classes of small arms, and to make, repeal, and alter any new Rules and Regulations, and any new scales in that behalf. And whereas since the passing of the said Act certain barrels of small arms have come into use which are known in the Gun Trade as " Chokebored " barrels, being barrels whereof some portion of the diameter of the bore at the muzzle is less than the diameter of the bore at some point behind the muzzle. And whereas the proof and the Rules and Regulations stated in Schedule B to the said Act, or some of them, respectively, have been found and are deemed by the two Companies unsuitable to Choke-bored barrels. And whereas the said Rules and Regulations stated in Schedule B to the said Act, with respect to the " Marks of Proof," and with respect to the "Mode of affixing Proof Marks," or some of them have been found, and are deemed by the two Companies, insufficient. Now, therefore, the two Companies, with the approval of the Right Honourable Gathorne Hardy, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department, do hereby repeal and alter so much, but so much only, of the said Rules and Regulations as is inconsistent or at variance with the Rules and Regulations hereby made, and do make the following new Rules and Regulations, that is to say : -

Part I of these presents relates to Choke bored barrels.

Part II of these presents relates to marks of proof, and the effacing of marks of proof, upon the barrels of small arms.

#### PART I.

#### As to Choke-bored Barrels. Definitions.

1. In the construction of these presents, the following words and expressions have the following meanings: to wit, "Choke-bored barrels" means barrels whereof the diameter of the bore at the muzzle is less than the diameter of the bore at some point behind the muzzle, other than the chamber or recess which contains the cartridge. "The charge of shot" means the aggrégate quantity of shot to be used for the definitive proof of one Choke-bored barrel.

#### Classification.

2. To the "classification of small arms" contained in Schedule B to the said Act shall be added a sixth class, comprising small arms having Choke-bored barrels.

3. The "third class" and the "fourth class," respectively, mentioned in said Schedule B, shall henceforth comprise the several and respective classes or descriptions of small arms therein mentioned, except such small arms as shall be constructed with one or more Choke-bored barrels.

4. Any small arm having one or more of its barrels Choke-bored, and having any other barrel or barrels, shall in respect of its Choke-bored barrel or barrels, be deemed to belong to the sixth class, and in respect of its other barrel or barrels to its proper class under said Schedule B.

#### Rule of Proof.

5. For the definitive proof of Choke-bored barrels, shot shall be used instead of bullets. The shot used shall be of lead, and of the size and description known in the Gun Trade as Soft Shot -Size No. 6. The charge of shot shall be, in the aggregate, of the weight prescribed as the weight of the bullet for proof, by the scale set forth in the said Schedule B, called "Scale for proof of small arms of every description except rifled small arms," taking the diameter of the bore of the barrel at its widest part, exclusive of the chamber or recess containing the cartridge.

6. The wads used shall be placed, one over the powder, and the other over the charge of shot.

7. Barrels for arms of the sixth class shall be proved provisionally and definitively, and nothing in these presents contained shall alter or affect, or be deemed to alter or affect, the mode of provisional proof.

#### Conditions Precedent to Proof.

8. The conditions precedent to proof, as to barrels for arms of the Sixth Class, shall be the same as are stated in Schedule B to the said Act, with reference to barrels for arms of the Second and Fourth Classes, with such addition thereto as hereinafter stated.

9. If any barrel, not being a Choke-bored barrel, after being definitively proved and duly marked as so proved, shall be converted into a Choke-bored barrel, such barrel, if entitled, under section 114 of the said Act, to be deemed a barrel proved provisionally shall be deemed to have been proved provisionally within the meaning of section 7 of the Rule of Proof set forth in these presents, but shall be liable and shall be subjected to further definitive proof according to its class, and in accordance with the same section.

10. If the converted barrel stands proof, the person or persons respectively entitled under the said Act to impress marks of proof on the barrel, shall impress on the barrel a new definitive proof mark, denoting the definitive proof of a Choke-bored barrel.


11. If any Choke-bored barrel, after being proved and marked as proved provisionally, and whether or not it has been proved and marked as proved definitively, shall be converted into a barrel that is not Choke-bored, such barrel, if entitled under section 114 of the said Act, to be deemed a barrel proved provisionally, shall be deemed to have been proved provisionally, within the meaning of section 7 of the Rule of Proof set forth in these presents, but such barrel shall be liable, and shall be subjected to definitive proof, or, as the case may be, to further definitive proof, such proof to be according to the class to which the barrel belongs.

12. If such converted barrel as last mentioned stands proof, the person or persons respectively entitled under the said Act to impress marks of Proof on the barrel, shall impress on the barrel a fresh definitive proof mark, denoting the definitive proof of a barrel not being a Choke-bored barrel. 13. All Choke-bored barrels sent for proof to the Proof House, or any branch Proof House, of either of the said two Companies. shall be accompanied by a statement in writing signed by or on behalf of the owner or owners of such barrels, that they are Choke-bored barrels, which statement shall be delivered at the Proof House, or branch Proof House, along with the barrels to which it relates, and unless such statement be so sent and delivered, no liability shall be incurred to the owner or owners of any such barrels, by proving the same as if they were not Choke-bored.

#### PART II.

#### As to Marks of Proof.

14. The marks denoting definitive proof of Choke-bored barrels shall be the proper letter or figure or figures, denoting the gauge size of the barrel at its widest part, exclusive of the Chamber or recess containing the cartridge, followed immediately, except in the case hereinafter excepted, by the letter B, and the proper letter or figure or figures denoting the gauge size of the barrel at its muzzle, followed immediately by the letter M, which letters or figures denoting the gauge sizes, respectively, shall be struck at the definitive proof; and the proof and view marks now used by the said two Companies, respectively, as described and delineated in Schedule B aforesaid, with the addition of the words "Not for Ball," which words shall be struck on the barrel on that side of the letters B and M, respectively, which is nearest to the muzzle (videlicet):



The excepted case hereinbefore referred to is that of barrels, the bore of which is enlarged immediately behind the muzzle, but of which, except such enlargement, and also except the chamber or recess containing the cartridge, the bore is not in any part of it larger than at the muzzle.

As to every such barrel, the word "Choke" shall be substituted for the words "Not for Ball" in the proof mark aforesaid, but in all other respects the marks denoting definitive proof of Chokebored barrels of every description shall be identical.

15. The marks denoting definitive proof of barrels not being Choke-bored barrels, shall be, the proper letter or figure or figures denoting the gauge size of the barrel, which letter or figure or figures shall be struck at the definitive proof; and the proof and view marks, now used by the said two Companies respectively as described and delineated in Schedule B to the said Act.

16. When any barrel of any small arm, which barrel has been proved definitively, or which has been proved in the state for definitive proof, but accoraing to the scale for provisional proof, is brought to the Proof House, or any branch Proof House of either of the said two Companies, to be proved again, definitively, or according to the scale for provisional proof, if such barrel upon being so proved again, does not stand proof, the person or persons respectively, who, under the said Act, is or are entitled to impress marks of proof on such barrel, shall efface all the existing marks of definitive proof there rom.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1853," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution among it the Next of Kin or others entitled, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deccased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the London Gazette, and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as Next of Kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the date and place of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace ; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared. — EFFECTS, 1873-4.

- So much of the Lynn and Hunstanton line of the Hunstanton and West Norfolk Railway Company, and so much of the railways of the Great Eastern Railway Company as will be situate between the intended junction of Railway No. 1 with the said Lynn and Hunstanton line of the Hunstanton and West Norfolk Railway Company and the King's Lynn Station, including that station. So much of the Fakenham Branch of the
- Great Eastern Railway as will be situate between the intended junction of Railway No. 2 therewith and the Fakenham Station, including that station.
- All or any railways of the King's Lynn Dock Company.

To requi e the Companies or persons owning or working the said railways or undertakings

respectively, to receive, book through, forward, accommodate and deliver, on and from the same, and at the stations, warehouses, and booking offices thereof, all traffic of whatever description coming from or destined for the undertaking of the Company, upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon, or failing such agreement, as shall be settled by arbitration, or as may be defined by the Bill; and if need be, to alter the tolls and charges which the said Companies may respectively receive and take upon their respective undertakings, and to confer exemptions from such tolls and charges.

) YE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made by the Wantage Tramway Company Limited, under the powers conferred on the Company by the Tramways Act, 1870:

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make bye-laws or regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the platform pointed out by the conductor, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage. 4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws and regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and if found in the interior of any carriage shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carrisge upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. The Company may refuse to carry any person who has any infectious disorder. If any person who has any such disorder is found upon the premises of the Company, or travels or attempts to travel on the tramway of the Company without the special permission of the Company, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, in addition to the forfeiture of any fare which he may have paid, and may be removed at the first opportunity from the Company's premises. Any person who has charge of any person suffering from an infectious disorder while upon the premises of the Company, or travelling or attempting to travel on the tramway, or who aids or assists any person suffering from such disorder in being upon the premises of the Company, or travelling or attempting to travel on the tramway, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, unless the person suffer-ing from- such disorder be travelling with the special permission of the Company.

10. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for the journey.

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11. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Company, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

12. A return ticket is granted solely for the purpose of enabling the person for whom the same is issued to travel therewith to and from the stations marked thereon, and is not transferable. Any person who sells or attempts to sell, or parts or attempts to part with the possession of the return half of any return ticket in order to enable any other person to travel therewith, is hereby subjected to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, and any person purchasing such half of a return ticket, or travelling or attempting to travel therewith, shall be liable to pay the fare which he would have been liable to pay for the single journey, and shall, in addition thereto, be subjected to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

13. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

14. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

15. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage or travel therein, otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

16. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage, when warned by the conductor not to do so.

17. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

18. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

19. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

20. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so Any dog or other animal by the conductor. taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation, shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately, upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

21. No person shall travel in or on any car-

riage of the Company with loaded fire-arms. 22. Every driver of any omnibus, fly, car-riage, cart, waggon, or other vehicle shall, while in or upon any station, yard, or other premises of the Company, and so far as regards his conduct as such driver, obey the reasonable directions of

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the Company's officers and servants duly authorised in that behalf.

23. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty, upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company, or upon or in any of the stations, works, or premises of the Company connected therewith, and no person (not being an officer or servant of the Company) shall wilfully interfere with any carriage, waggon, truck, or other vehicle belonging to the Company, except with the express permission or under the direction of the Company or one of its servants.

24. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these bye-laws and regulations to the best of his ability.

25. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws or regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

26. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company and having charge of a carriage.

27. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these bye-laws and regulations.

28. These bye-laws shall come into force on the 15th day of January, 1876.
