Vempo, 7an. 27. On Monday laft ärived here a Turtin Officer of the Garifon of Sigeth, with the Capitulation agreed on betwixt the Baffa of that Fortrefs and the Commander of the Imperial Forces that formed the Blockade. The, next day he had Audience of the Count de SturembergevicePrefident of the Council of War; and having fince received his Difpatches, and the Emperbors Ratif. "cution of the faid Copituptition, he will part from hence to morrove on bis return to Sigeth, with the fanne Convoy:that brought bim hither:. The Imperial Troops that are now before sigeth are Oqdered"to march towiards Canifa, ta re-nforge the Elockade of that ऐlace, which cannot: pofThity hold out much longer. The Emperor has findfly refolved to give Audience this welt to the Turlith Ambaffidors, "after which the luperial Comnifilianers, with the Minifers that are here on the part of the Allies, will forthwithenter fhto Conference with them, to hear their Propooals. In themean time the Preparations fur, the War are contimued with all poofible dif.ence and applicatienseflecially towards Germany, where the Emperde will have a very confiderable Army under the Command of the Dake of Lorraine. The King of Hung ary has the Small-Pox, but they being come out very. well; It's hoped he is out of alf tander.

Writeball, Febr. 12 Her Royal Highnef the Pincef of : Orange arived here this Afternoon; The welcom News whereof was rectived with RHuging of Bellis, Bonffes, and other publick Demogftrations of Joy.

Whiteball, Febr. 13. This morning the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Cormons being ACrembled at Weffiminfer, atod having agreed upon an Inftruniente in Writing, for Declaring the Prince and Princefi of Orange, King and 2yeen of $\dot{E}$ ngland, France, and Ireland, witth all he D ominions and Territories thereunto telonginge, and prefented the fanict to their Highneffes in the Baniquetting Houfe, and Received their Confent thereto: The faid Lords and Commona about Eleven of the Clock came down to Whiteball Gate, where ( Officers of Arms, Sergeants at Arms, Trumpett, and other Perfons concerned in the Solemnity, being fffembied, by Order fremt the Duke of Norfoll, Earl MarMal of England: Sir 7ho. St. Georye Kt Garter Principal King of Arms, having received a Proclamation, and the faid Officers of Arn,sbring Oidered by the Houfe of Lords forth$w$ it Wh $^{2} 0$ Proclaim the fame, Yoo $k$ Herald (after the Trưmpets had thrice Younded) Proclaimed it at. Whbit:bal-Gate accordingly (the faid Garter Reasing it to him by Periods) in the prefence of the foid Lords and Conmens and Nultitudes of Pcople there Affembled, who concluded the fanne with repeated Acclamations of Joy. From whence they pooceeded in this manner. Finf, the Head Baylff of Wydminfler with his Men ; Next, the huight Mai hals Meri, then a Clafs of Tiumpers, nollowed by the Sergeant Trumpeter; Then an Officer of Arms fingly, followed by fix other, each acconpaniod with a Sergeant at Arms; Then Garter King of Arms with the Proclamation, aceminpanied by the Unher of the Black Rod; Then phe Lord Marquifs of Halffax, who Executes the Place of Speaker in the Houfe of Lords, in his Cuach, attended by Sir Roger Hajont, Eldeft Sergeant at Arms, with his Mace; Then Hinry PourleE Eq; spenabre of the Houff of Combions, in his Coact, atended by sergeant Topham, with his Mace; Tree the Duke of Noffolk, Earl Ma Whal of England, in his Coach, followed by the reit of the Reers in Oider, all in Coachés ; Lattly, the Menbers of the Huive of Commons in their Coaches. 1 hus they Proceeded to Tomple-B.al, where the (iates being thut, two of the Officers of Arms (altended by a Sergeant at Arous and two Trumpets) knocking theieat, the Slueriffs of London and Middlyex conving to the Gate, and being hiturned of the Occ.fion of their Coming, O:-
dered the Gates to be opened, and the whoie Froceeding entred (except the Bailiff of Weffmst fier at.d his Men wbo went off there) and the Loid Mayor, Recorder, and Aldermen receiving them in their Formantitie, a fecond Proclamation was made between the two Temple Gates; and the fatt Alderment, Sheriff and Lord Mayorfalling itfto the Proceeding, at Woodfreet end in cheapfide Their Majeities were Proclaimed a Third tink; and to at the Roval Exchande in Cornbil/a Fourth time ; each Proclanation being ecchoed with Univerfal Acclamations of Joy by the Multitudts of Pcople which crowded the Streets, Windows ard Balconies; the Streets all the way from Temple Bar to the Royd E C Change being lined with four Regiments of the City Militia. . Thus the Ceremony thded, and the night was concluded with Borfiries, ringing of Belis; and all other Exprefions of Duty and Aftection to Ther Majetties, King WIL LIAM, and Queen $M A R X$, with hearty withes of Their Long and Happy Reign.
