THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a Note, dated the 11th instant, from the Austro-Hungarian Ambassador at this Court, containing a denunciation, on the part of the Austro-Hungarian Government, of the Treaty of Commerce between Great Britain and Austria of the 16th of December, 1865, and of the Supplementary Convention of the 30th of December,

HEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding "of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever "it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Pro-" whenever it shall be represented to him by the " bishop of any diocese, or by the bishops of any "two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, "vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or "dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five "hundred persons, and the aggregate yearly value " shall not exceed five hundred pounds, may, with "advantage to the interests of religion, be united "into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the " Province shall inquire into the circumstances of "the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear "to him that such union may be usefully made, "and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that "the patron or patrons of the said benefices, " sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicar-"ages respectively, is or are consenting theretc, " such consent being signified in writing under the "hands of such patron or patrons, the said Arch-bishop shall, six weeks before certifying such " inquiry and consent to Her Majesty, as herein-"after directed, cause, with respect to his own "diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, "and in other cases a copy in writing of the " aforesaid representation, to be affixed on or near
