(No. 179.)—Australia, East Coast—New Queensland.

(1.) Revolving Light on Cape Capricorn.

THE Colonial Government of Queensland has given notice, that a light is now exhibited from a lighthouse on Cape Capricorn.

The light is a revolving light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, and elevated 310 feet above the level of the sea.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the third order.

(2.) Probable Alteration in Cape Bowling-Green Light.

Also, that in consequence of changes having taken place in the outlying banks off Cape Bowling-green, causing the sea to make serious inroads on the shore, it may be found necessary to remove the lighthouse, in which case a temporary fixed light will be exhibited instead of the revolving light at present shown, until permanent arrangements can be made.

The temporary light would be seen in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles.
