Falmouth, Mar. 9. N Thursday last the Fleet of Merchant ships, which have lain long in this Harbor, detein'd by contrary winds and ill weather, put to fea with a fair gale, and 'tis hoped have had a profperous paffage. Plymouth, Mar. 10. Yesterday in the morning arrived

here the Deptford Ketch, having on Sunday night left Sir Thomas Allen with the Squadron under his command off this Port, bound to the Weftwards, and this morning put outagain to fea to attend him. This day went out from this Port 50 fail of English and Dutch ships outwards bounds and about 60 fail more have been discovered passing by to the Westwards (as supposed) from the Downs.

Here are lately come in about 7 Colliers from Wales, and one Veffel from Ireland, all of them belonging to this Town.

Tarmouth, Mar. 11. Yesterday failed hence five or fix thips laden and bound for Rotterdam, and this day about 30 fail more went out of this Road and Harbour bound to the Northwards.

Genoua, Feb. 29 Yefterday was brought in hither a Corfair of Majorca, taken by one of the Gallies belonging to this Republique, with a French Barque his Prize, but 'tis believed both of them will be fuddenly difmift. The French Privateers have of late taken feveral veffels belonging to Merchants of this place, bound for Spain, and 'tis laid gave chace to leveral Hamburgers bound tither from Spain, but happily eleaping them are put into Legorn

From Catalonia we are told that the Spanish forces grow very numerous in those parts, and with the forces which are daily expected from the Frontiers of Portugal may make up 2 confiderable Army.

From Milan we are told that two Regiments of Foot late ly railed in Germany, are fafely arrived in that State, con-fifting of 4000 able Souldiers befides Officers, to who'n the Governour has affigned convenient Quarters, and that the Regiment of Horle belonging to the Count de Schellard, but led at present by the Baron de Macay, his Lieutenant Colonel, was upon the way, and wou d in few days arrive, and that the other Regiment of Horse would in little time be in readiness to follow them.

The Duke of Savey has lately dispatcht some Ministers to Don Louis Pons de Lcon, who have frequent conferences about affairs of great concernment, that Duke being fomewhar concerned that the "F each have lately demande fage for their Army through Savoy and Picamont f more convenient invalion of Milan, which is a poi will require form confideration.

Malaga, Feb. 28. The 25th inftant arrived Port fix Ships richly laden from Turky, viz. the L. Turky, Zant, and Tunis Merchants, the Golden Fl and the George, and with them the Tarmouth Pink from Legorn. Aboard the London Merchant is returning the Countels of Winchelfey, with her three Sons born in Conftantinople.

Rome, March 3. The Fench and Spanish Ambasiadors. have lately had several Audiences from His Holiness ; who upon all occasions feems infinitely zealous for encouraging the Peace between the Two Crowns ; that by an happy Union the Christian World might without interruption em-ploy its Force to put a ftop to the Turks Defigns upon Can-dia: for which end the Pope ules all his endeavou s, and has ordered a Squadron of his Ga lies to be fitted up with all diligence, to be commanded by his Nephew Bali Vincenzo

Respiction who with a Train of many Captains and other Officers, is gone for Civita Vecchia, to take possession of his Command, to take a View of the Port and Fortreffes there, and to give fuch Orders as are necessary for the hastening out of his Squadron.

On the 23th paft, after a long Sickneis, died here Cardi-nal Hierome Farnefe a Roman, and a Creature of the late Pope Allexander the VII. in the 69th year of his Age a and the roth of his Cardinalship, by whole decease five Capps are now at the disposal of His Holinels.

The Pope having fome dayes fince in a Confiltory no-minated Monfegnior Varefe Auditor de la Rosa, to succeed as Governor of Rome, in the place of Monlegnior Borromee, who is to be employed as Nuncie, to the Court of Spain , was on Wednelday last pleased to give him the Staff of Command, the Ufual Formality upon Collation of that Charge.

On Monday last was held a Consistory, wherein several Vacant Bilhopricks were propoled by their respective Cardinals Protectors ; where also was debated and determined the bulinels of the Coadjutorfhip of Munfler : which is adjudged and confirme to Monlegnior Firstemberg, Prince and Bishop of Paterburne ; who is livewife to fucceed in the Bithoprick of Mansfer, after the decease of the prefene Bifhop.

Mudrid, March 9. Yeflerday arrived here the Muf-covite Amballador, and is lodged in the H ule formerly inhabited by the French Minister the Archbishop d' Ambrun.

To morrow is to be proclaimed the Peace lately made between this Crown and Pertugal, to the great fatisfaction of both Kingdomes.

Don fuan is not yet departed from this place, being not yet fully recovered from his distemper, but past all danger, and may in few dayes begin his journey.

Let ers of the 26th pail from Cadiz, informus that the Mary Role Fregar, with the Bantam and Prudence, were in Port, intending for Genoua ; waiting onely for a fair wind , having taken in a rich freight : and that a Squadron of the Spanish Armada was ready to fail for Corugnd, having aboard them above two thousand old souldiers designed tor Flanders.

Paris, March 17. The 14th inftant being appointed by His Majelly for a Thanksgiving-Day to be held in this City, for his late fuce is in Franche Comte; the French Regiment of His Majefties Guards, placed themfelves on each fide of the way from the Po t St. Honore, to the Church de Nostre Dame ; where according to His Maj fties Letters fent the day before by the Sieur Saintot Mafter of the Ceremonies, the Parliament in their 'carlet Robes, with their Chief President , and the Mareschall d' Aumont our Sovernour, took their places at the right hand of the Quire \$ and over again it them the Chamber of Accounts and Court of Aids in their Robes of the fame colour; and below them the Corporation of the City, with the Provoft of the Merchants. About 3 in the Afternoon His Majefty, sc4 companied by Monlieur, with the Prince of Conde, the Dukes d' Enguyen and Noailles, and the Captain of the Guards, was received and complemented at the Church Door by the Archb fhop and the reft of the Chapter \$ and prefented with Holy Water and a Crofs : from whence the Guard of the hundred Swifle, with their Drums, and His Majefies Trumpers leading the ways followed by the Mafter of the Ceremonies and his Aflistant, and the Heralds in their Coats of Armes , and Cadaces in their hands & Hig Majefty

Hague, Mar. 19. We know not yet what guels to make of the pielent Negotiation for the accommodation of the differences between the two Crowns, e pecially, fince we find that France, though accepting the Alternative, and agreeing to a Trace till the end of this month, feem to doubt of the Marquil's de Castel Rodrigo's powers and fuffers the Forces thill to continue their hostility as before.

On Friday latt the States disposed of several Commands in the Army, as of Colonels, Lieutenant-Colonels, and Majors, and ate making some progress for the raising of 12000 men that was forme by projected; they are also quickning the toward admiralties to hasten the Equipping of the Fleet of 48 men of War intended to be sent to lea this Spring.

We have not yet any farther advice of an Embargo upon our fhips in Portugal, and therefore can ot but a while fulpend out belief of it.

Some warm reports here have been, as if about 3000 of the Bishop of Munsters forces had latey appeared near Entfchooten, and made some disturbance there, which occasioned a great confultation here.

Lis also reported that the Duke of Lorain has in readied nets all Army of 6000 Foot and readied railing methodotes, intending to complete an Army of 15000 men, but upon what delign is Rough Said.

The States have lately had faine conference with the Field-Marfhals, concerning the affairs of the Atmy, and have Ordered thas feveral companies shall b fudthenly drawn rogether to joyn with 5500, of the Lucomburg forces intended for the fervice of the States.

for the fervice of the States. Bruges Mar. 20. The great preparations made by the French in all their Frontier Garrifons, gives us realon ro apprehend they have intentions of making fome confiderable attempt, as foon as the fhort Truce allotted for the Ceffation shall be ended, which has had hitherto fo little influence upon their forces here, that though informed thereof by a Trumpet fent from Bruffelruo the Officer that commanded at the Siege belo.e Guenap, he pretended want of notice, and Orders from His General, without which he could not defilt, and condming before it, forced them ro a fu tendet on the 15th inftant, and the fame day a party of the French plundeted the Abby of Aflegem about a League diffent from Alloff.

From Dougt we are told that great conveys of all forts of Ammunition daily arrive there, and that the great Ordnance defigned for Battery lie ready upon the Key, and 'tis believed, if that a timely peace prevent them not, they may have a defign to attempt either Conde or St. Gillain.

There is lately publisht a Placaers from the Marquis de Cafiel Rodrigo, for the release of all criminal Offenders from Prilon, (Sactilegiour perfons only accepted) upon condition that they oblige themlelves to serve His Catholique Majelly two years in the war, which is already putting into execution.

A Courlet arriving the orth inflant at Bruffels from Paris has had Audience from His Excellency the Marquils de Cuftel Rodrigo, bringing with him a choice of the Alternatives, of which the faid Marquilles refolution is speedily defired, whereupon, the principal Ministers were that Evening lummoned to a Confidtation, and 'tis believed fich refolution will be taken in that point, that in few days a happy end may be pure the war.

His Majesties men at Armes are commanded to be in beadiness to march by the tec nd of the next Moneth, intending to be in the lucid by the 15th.
