TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE DUKE OF EDINBERGH, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large card, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to he presented; must leave at the Lord Chamber-lain's Office, St. James's Palace, *hefore twelve u'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intima-tion from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is wise to be void and of none effect.

Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly, written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at one o'clock.

THE Board of Trade have received from Her Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the annexed copy of a Proclamation by the President of Liberia, respecting the importation and sale of arms and munitions of war in the county of Maryland :--

By the President of the Republic of Liberia.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS in consequence of the hostile attitude assumed by certain tribes within and under the jurisdiction of this Republic, against the Government of Liberia, the legislature did, at its late session, authorise the President, by proclamation or otherwise, to interdict certain trading points along the coast; and whereas it is not the policy of the Government to unnecessarily restrain the privileges of its citizens.

Now, therefore, I, James Spriggs Payne, President of the Republic of Liberia, do hereby proclaim and make known to all whom it may concern, that on and after the 21st day of February, A.D. 1876, no person shall be allowed to prosecute any trade of any kind whatsoever, at any town or place within the county of Maryland, except the port of Harper, until this interdict shall be revoked.

And I do further proclaim and make known, that on and after the said 21st day of February A.D. 1876, that, as provided for in an Act passed, at the late session of the legislature, and approved February 2nd, 1876, forbidding the importation and sale of fire-arms and munitions of warfare into the county of Maryland, "it shall be unlawful for any foreigner, residing in the Republic, any captain, supercargo of any vessel or steamer, or any citizen to import into the county of Maryland (commencing from the coast including Grand Cessters on the north-west of Maryland county, extending to the south-east boundary of the Republic's territory), any gunpowder, guns, and munitions of war of whatever description, unless for government, until after the cessation of t he war in Maryland with the Grebo confederated tribes," under pain of the penaltics set forth in said Act.

And I do also proclaim and make known, that on and after the said 21st day of February, A.D. 1876, the proclamation issued on the 22nd day of November, A.D. 1875, forbidding the sale and furnishing of fire-arms and ammunition to the aboriginal native or natives within the boundaries of this Republic, is revoked and shall be of no effect except in those parts herein interdicted and proscribed, that is to say "commencing from the coast including Grand Cessters on the north-west of Maryland County extending to the south-east boundary of the Republic's territory," and the citzens or foreigners shall be privileged to deal in said prohibited articles in other parts as before the issuing of the aforesaid proclamation.

And this present interdict and prohibition shall continue in full force until due notice shall have been given to the contrary by the proclamation of the President.

And I do hereby require all Officers, Civil or Military, within this Republic to take special care in seeing the terms of this interdict fully carried out, and all citizens and residents in this Republic, and persons in charge of any vessel coming to

our ports, to control and govern themselves accordingly.

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REGULATIONS made by the Public Works Loan Commissioners for carrying into effect "The Public Works Loans Act, 1875."

1. All words used in these Regulations shall have the same meaning as is assigned to them by "The Public Works Loans Act, 1875," which Act is hereinafter referred to as "The Act."

2. The Loan Commissioners shall elect a Chairman and Deputy Chairman, and three Commissioners shall form a quorum.

3. If at any meeting the Chairman is not present, the Deputy Chairman shall be the Chairman of the meeting, and if neither the Chairman nor Deputy Chairman be present, then the Commissioners present shall choose one of their number to be the Chairman of such meeting.

4. Meetings of the Commissioners shall be held as often as the business to be transacted may be found to require, and shall be convened by notice from the Secretary.

5. All questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

6. A book to be called the minute book shall be kept, in which applications for loans and minutes of the proceedings and resolutions of the Commissioners shall be recorded, and such other books shall be kept as the Commissioners may think necessary.

7. The fees or sums to be paid by the applicants in respect of Loans on rates, pursuant to section 41, shall not exceed the following sums, viz. :--

Where a Loan is advanced by instalments, secured by one deed, an additional fee of £3 3s. shall be paid on account of each advance after the first.

In addition to the above, the applicants shall pay all disbursements incurred by the Loan Commissioners in respect of their several applications.

In cases of all business not being a Loan on Rate, the sums payable shall be fixed by the Commissioners, regard being had to each particular case.

8. When the Loan Commissioners shall have determined upon any amount of money to be advanced by way of loan pursuant to section 9 of the Act, the said Commissioners, or any three, or more of them, shall forthwith certify such amount to the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt for the time being, and at the foot of every such certificate the Secretary shall state the name or names of the person or persons by whom every such certificate is to be presented to the said Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, and upon every such certificate being lodged for seven clear days at the office of the said Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt, the Comptroller-General or other proper officer of the said Commissioners shall sign an order appended to such certificate for the payment of the sum mentioned therein to the person or persons named at the foot of the certificate, or to one of such persons, which order shall be addressed to the cashiers of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England; and the signature of such person or persons, jointly or severally, shall be a sufficient discharge to the said Commissioners

for the Reduction of the National Debt, and to the said Governor and Company respectively, provided the total amount directed to be paid by such certificate, or certificates, respectively sliall not at any time exceed the amount for the time being standing to the credit of the account referred to in section 16 of the Act.

9. Upon delivery to the borrower, or his nominee, of the certificate referred to in the last preceding regulation, such borrower, or nominee, shall pay at the office of the Loan Commissioners the amount of the fees referred to in Regulation No. 7 as payable on any loan, or instalment of a loan, for which such certificate shall have been issued, together with the amount of stamp-duty thereon, and the further amount, if any, of disbursementsin respect thereof, and the receipt for any such amounts shall be signed by the officer in charge of the accounts, or, in his absence, by such person as may be nominated by the Secretary.

10. All moneys payable towards the discharge of advances made by the Loan Commissioners, and in payment of interest thereon, shall be paid by the borrower or his agent into the Bank of England, to the credit of "The Public Works Loans Account," being the account directed by the Treasury under section 43, and such payments shall be made under authority to be obtained at the office of the Loan Commissioners, empowering the Bank of England to receive the sum therein mentioned, and the receipt of the Bank of England for such payment shall be obtained at the office of the Loan Commissioners on the succeeding day.

day. 11. Any receipt required to be given by, or on behalf of, the Loan Commissioners (other than for money paid into the Bank of England under Regulation No. 10, and for sums payable under Regulation No. 9), and any receipt and further discharge, if any, to be given when all money due under a mortgage has been fully paid, shall be so given by the Secretary.

12. Any notice required by Section 23 of the Act to be published, shall be published once in a Local Paper circulating in the district where the Rate is intended to be levied.

13. All documents of the Loan Commissioners not required to be signed by them shall, if purporting to be signed by the Secretary, be deemed, until the contrary is proved to be made or issued by the Loan Commissioners, and all directions given or acts done by the Secretary shall be deemed, until the contrary is proved, to be given or done by the Loan Commissioners, and all documents may be proved by the production of a copy or extract purporting to be signed by the Secretary to be true.

For the purposes of this Regulation no proof shall be required of the handwriting or official position of the person purporting to be the Secretary.

14. The Loan Commissioners regard being had to section 36 of the Act shall, whenever they advance a loan on the security of a rate, inform the Local Government Board of such advance having been made, and of the purposes thereof.

15. The Loan Commissioners shall cause to be prepared an annual statement to the 31st day of March in each year, of the amounts issued to them for the purpose of making advances by way of loan under various Acts, the amounts advanced by them, the amounts paid into the Exchequer in repayment of such advances and for interest thereon, and the balances outstanding, and such statement shall be included in the annual report referred to z in section 5, sub-section 3.

16. To enable intending borrowers to make the statement referred to in section 13 of the Act the Loan Commissioners shall cause a form of statement to be prepared and issued to such intending borrowers on their written notification of intention to borrow, which form duly filled up must be returned to the Loan Commissioners on or before 31st December in each year.

The Loan Commissioners may, provided such notification be received at their office on or before. the said 31st December, ext nd the period for return of such form of statement to any day not later that the 14th January in each year.

17. The Assistant-Secretary of the Loan Commissioners shall, under their directi ns, be competent to perform any act authorized by the above regulations to be performed by the Secretary.

NOTICE TO MARINERS. (No. 41.)-England-East Coast-Farn Islands.

(1) Fog-signal at Longstone Lighthouse.

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice, that on or about the 1st July, 1876, it is intended to establish a powerful fog horn on Longstone Rock, Farn Islands.

The horn will give *two* short blasts immediately following each other; repeated similarly *every two minutes*.

(2) Intended alteration in Newarp Light.

Also, that in order to improve the character of the Newarp Light, it is i. inded, about the middle of *April*, 1877, to make the following alteration, viz :-

The three fixed lights a present exhibited from the light-vessel will be discontinued, and instead thereof one revolving white light, showing three flashes in quick succession, followed by an eclipse of thirty-six seconds, the whole revolution occupying one minute, will be exhibited.

The light will be elevated 36 feet above the sea.

- (3) Intended alteration in Goodwin Light.

Also, that in order more effectually to mark the North Sand Head of the Goodwin Sands, it is intended, about the middle of *April*, 1877, to make the following alteration in the character of the light exhibited from the North Sand Head Lightvessel.

The three fixed lights will be discontinued, and instead thereof, one revolving white light, showing three flashes in quick succession, followed by an eclipse of thirty-six seconds, the whole revolution occupying one minute, will be exhibited.

The light will be elevated 36 feet above the sea.

Further notice will be given relative to these lights when the changes are effected.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 42.) - MEDITERRANEAN - SPAIN.

(1.) Non-existence of Pier Light at Tarragona.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 156. dated 8th November, 1875, on the exhibition of a green light at the extremity of the west or inner mole in the course of construction at Tarragona :---Information has been received that no light is

now exhibited on the end of the western mole.

FRANCE.

(2.) Light-Vessel at Marseille.

The French Government has given notice, that the south-west entrance to the National Basin of Marseille will be closed, that the outer wall carried up uniformly with the adjacent parts, and that a light-vessel exhibiting three red lights is now moored in a line with, and 760 yards from, the north end of the outer wall of the basin, to which distance the outer wall or jetty is to be continued.

Note.-Vessels are not to pass between this light-vessel and the end of the outer wall.

ITALY.

(3.) Light on North End of Breakwater, Leghorn.

The Italian Government has given notice, that the following alteration has been made in the light on the north end of the breakwater at Leghorn, with the view of enabling vessels making the port from the northward to avoid the Meloria Bank ; viz. : -

The light now shows a section of green light through an arc of 65° covering the Meloria Bank.

Nore.-Vessels from the northward making the port should keep in the white light when passing the Meliora Bank.

MALTA.

(4.) New Buoys in Grand Harbour. Information has been received that the following buoys have been placed at the entrance of the

Marsa (Grand Harbour) Malta ; viz. :--Gun Wharf Point. The ledge of rocks off Gun Wharf Point is now marked by a red pole buoy moored on its outer edge in 28 feet, and 52 yards distant from the shore.

From it, Spencer Monument bears S.S.E. 1/2 E. Hanzir or Magazine Point, S.W. by S.

Isola Point, E. by N. 🛊 N.

At 15 yards inshore of the buoy there is a depth of 3 fathoms.

Magazine Point .--- The rocky tongue extending from Hanzir or Magazine Point is marked at its extreme by a red pole buoy moored in 25 feet, and distant 72 yards from the point.

From it, Spencer Monument bears E.S.E.

Magazine Point, S.S.W.

Isola Point, N.E. by E. 1 E.

At 15 yards inshore of the buoy there is a depth of 3 fathoms.

[All bearings are Magnetic. Variation at Malta, 8° Westerly in 1876.]

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 43.)-MEDITEBRANEAN-EGYPT.

(1.) Fixed Red Light on Breakwater, Alexandria.

THE Egyptain Government has given notice, that from the 1st April, 1876, a light would be exhibited from the south-west extremity of the breakwater at the entrance of the Port of Alexandria.

The light is a fixed red light, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 3 miles.

Also, that from the same date, the light-vessel stationed off the south-west end of the breakwater would be removed.

BLACK SEA.

(2.) Alteration in Quarantine Mole Light, Odessa.

The Russian Government has given notice, that the two fixed red lights hitherto exhibited at the extremity of the Quarantine Mole at Odessa have been replaced by one fired red light, exhibited from a wooden platform on the mole head. The light is elevated 22 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen for a distance of 5 miles.

Nore.-When the mole is inaccessible in bad weather, this light cannot be exhibited.

Adriatic Sea.

(3.) Provisional Light at Port Volosca.

The Austrian Government has given notice, that a provisional red and while light is exhibited from a lantern placed about 75 yards from the head of the breakwater now in the course of construction at Port Volosca, head of Quarnero Gulf. The light is elevated 22 feet above the sea. The change of the light from red to white indicates the direction of the dike now in construction.

(4.) Alteration in Mole Light, Curzola.

Also, that the fixed white light exhibited at the extremity of the new mole at Curzola, has been replaced by a *fixed red* light.

(5.) Green Light on Colludarz Point.

Also, that a fixed green light is now exhibited on Colludarz Point, entrance to Port Lussi Piccolo (Port Augusto). The light is elevated 29 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be scon from a distance of about 3 miles.
